There are 91 performances, 89 matinee and two charities. 3 The Division is recommending denial of 4 this request to amend their license. 5 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you Ms. Pouncey. 6 7 Can you elaborate on why the Commission staff is 8 recommending a denial for this application renewal? MS. POUNCEY: Yes, ma'am. 9 This is a 10 highlight permit. The statute doesn't have an 11 allowance for highlights to amend their license. 12 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. 13 Commissioners, I would just like to have our legal staff kind of elaborate a little bit further on the 14 applicable statutes related to this amended 15 16 application, please. Mr. Ross. 17 MR. MARSHMAN: Good morning. So, Ms. 18 Pouncey was correct of course, that this application 19 is to amend a series of games. There is no provision in Section 550.01215 Sub 3 that permits 20 21 the Commission to issue amendments to a schedule of 2.2 games. The Only authority by statute is to amend a 23 schedule of racing. 24 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. And the 25 Commission dealt with a similar issue, if I recall

Page 12 Consent Order that had an \$100 fine. 1 2 This is Respondent's first violation in 3 Florida. The case was presented at the October meeting with a \$50 fine. The Commission asked that 4 5 I provide more information regarding the manager who trained him in this case. 6 7 Following the meeting, investigations provided me with information that the manager has 8 9 since been terminated and excluded from the facility 10 for an unrelated theft incident. Also, I spoke with 11 the individual and they have no further violations 12 since the incident occurred. 13 Therefore, the Division would ask that the Commission approve the consent order in this case. 14 15 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you, Ms. 16 Alvarado. Any questions on this item? Therefore, the Division would ask that the Commission adopt the 18 19 Consent Order. 20 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you, Ms. 21 Alvarado. Commissioners, any questions on 3.3? Ιf 2.2 not, can we get a Motion to approve? 23 COMMISIONER REPP: (Inaudible) Motion. 24 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. Is there a 25 second?

Page 14 I'll second. 1 COMMISSIONER DRAGO: 2 VICE CHAIR BROWN: All those in favor say 3 aye. 4 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. On to 3.4. 5 MS. ALVARADO: 3.4 is South Marion Real 6 7 Estate Holdings which is Case Number 2023049873. Τn this case there was a filed administrative complaint 8 9 alleging that the Respondent violated Rule 7511.0129 by failing to issue a photo ID to a card room 10 employee. Respondent has one prior violation of 11 this rule which resulted in a \$250 fine. Respondent 12 has sent back the fine, settlement and consent order 13 in this case. It contained a \$500 fine. 14 Therefore, the Division would ask that the 15 16 Commission adopt the consent Order in this case. 17 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you, Ms. Alvarado. 18 I think that's an appropriate amount as 19 well. Commissioners, any questions? Can I get a Motion? Commissioner D'Aquila. 20 21 COMMISSIONER D'AQUILA: Yes, I'd like to 2.2 make a Motion to approve the recommendation of 23 Counsel. 24 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Okay. Is there a 25 second?

Page 15 I'll second. 1 COMMISSIONER DRAGO: 2 VICE CHAIR BROWN: All those in favor say 3 aye. 4 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. Thank you 5 for your work on that. On to Discussion of default 6 7 final orders. 4.1 through 4.7. MS. ALVARADO: 4.1 is Kevin Ramos. 8 9 2022-045861. In this case there was a five-count 10 administrative complaint alleging that while working at Casino Miami it was discovered that Respondent 11 12 was removing money from the ticket redemption unit 13 cassette and documenting the incorrect amount on the control log. This amount ended up totaling over 14 15 \$3500. 16 The Respondent was excluded and arrested 17 for grand theft. The Respondent failed to notify the Commission of his arrest and his conviction. 18 He 19 is subject to exclusion as well of revocation or 20 suspension of his license. 21 We attempted to serve Respondent via USPS and hand service. But we were unsuccessful. 2.2 23 Therefore, we published a notice in the local 24 newspaper. Respondent failed to respond to the 25 publication notice.

Page 16 Therefore, the Division would ask that the 1 2 Commission enter an order finding that the Respondent was given notice via publication and 3 4 failed to respond by the deadline, that the factual 5 allegations in the administrative complaint are 6 accepted as the facts in this case. 7 And concluding that Respondent 8 shall be added to the permanent exclusion list for all Pari-Mutuels and slot machine facilities and 9 10 that his slot machine, card room Pari-Mutuel occupational license is revoked. 11 12 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you for your thorough summary. ALVARADO: It's actually 4.4 and 25 4.81 are going to be withdrawn and moved to another

1 meeting. 2 VICE CHAIR BROWN: Thank you. Item 4.2 is Alexis Comano 3 MS. ALVARADO: 4 in Case Number 2022-051619. In this case you were 5 provided with a one-count complaint seeking the suspension of Respondent's Pari-Mutuel wagering 6 7 professional individual occupational license due to an outstanding debt related to horse racing in 8 9 Florida. We attempted to serve this Respondent 10 again via USPS and hand service but were 11 unsuccessful. 12 Therefore, we had posted a notice in a local newspaper. Respondent failed to respond to 13 the publication notice. 14 Therefore, the Division 15 would ask that the Commission enter an order that 16 17 Respondent was given notice via publication and failed to respond, that the facts in the 18 19 administrative complaint are accepted as the facts 20 in this case. 21 And concluding that Respondent's Pari-Mutuel wagering professional individual 2.2 23 occupational license shall be suspended until the Commission receives confirmation that the payment 24 25 has been satisfied.
