

#### Sir:

In compliance with Sub-section 2, Section 2 of Chapter 14832, Laws of Florida, Acts of 1931, as amended, the Florida State Racing Commission respectfully submits herewith its Thirteenth Annual Report for the period July 1, 1943 to June 30, 1944, inclusive.

S. J. Hilburn, of the Fifth Congressional District, who served the Commission and State's interests long and faithfully, died on the 27th day of September, 1943. Roy L. Patience was appointed to succeed Mr. Hilburn, and took office on November 8, 1943.

Henry S. Baynard resigned from the Commission on April 14, 1944, to run for State Senator from Pinellas County, and was reappointed following the first primary, at which he was nominated to said office by the voters of said county.

The Commissioners selected Alex M. Balfe as Chairman and Henry S. Baynard as Secretary, and they served, respectively, in said capacities during the entire term of their service on the Commission above shown.

William C. Brooker served as Attorney for the Commission for the full period covered by this report. All tracks licensed to conduct racing in Florida filed applications for racing dates for the 1943-1944 racing season in accordance with Law. Application for racing at the Hollywood Jockey Club, Inc., was made by L. M. Gerstel, Trustee in Bankruptcy of said Association. After exhaustive hearings and thorough consideration of said application and all evidence presented thereon the same was denied by the Commission on the 20th day of August, 1943. Open meetings were held in Miami, Florida, on July 24, 1943, and again on August 20, 1943, for the consideration of applications for racing dates. Representatives of all the tracks were present at the meetings at which their respective applications were considered. Each application and all evidence and arguments thereon were duly considered by the Commission. At the meeting on July 24, 1943, racing dates were allotted for the 1943-1944 racing season as follows:

By Act enacted at the 1943 session of the Florida Legislature the period of time for allowance of race meetings at horse and dog tracks was extended. The limitation to fifty (50) days at horse tracks and ninety (90) days at dog tracks, however, remained in effect. This permitted a wider and more equitable distribution of racing days. All tracks operated continuously for the period of time allotted except the Sanford-Orlando Kennel Club, Inc., where racing was interrupted without fault of said Association, from the 25th of February to the 3rd of March, 1944. By subsequent action the Commission extended racing at said track to the 28th day of April, 1944, affording said track the full period of ninety (90) days racing.

As required by law, an office was maintained throughout the year by the Commission in Tallahassee. However, as the work of the Commission is principally done at the Miami office, the personnel, space and equipment of the Tallahassee office has been reduced to the lowest practicable level. The Commission highly commends its officials and office staff and all its employees for their loyalty to the Commission and for the efficient and conscientious manner in which their services were performed.

During the past fiscal year the Commission held eight official meetings. These meetings were held with reference to applications for racing dates, administrative matters, licensing of track officials, review of steward rulings and decisions, and to supervise the conduct of horse and dog race meetings and jai-alai exhibitions pursuant to its rules and State law. The meetings were held at the following designated cities and times:

Miami—July 23, 24, 1943. Jacksonville—August 20, 1943. Miami—December 14, 1943. Miami—January 8, 1944. Miami—February 3, 4, 5, 1944. Miami—February 12, 1944. Miami—March 2, 3, 4, 1944. Miami—April 7, 1944.

The Commission has been vigilant in detecting and preventing the stimulation of horses and dogs. The work of its Chief Veterinarian, Dr. E. D. Clawson, and its Chief Chemist, Dr. Walter Volke, has been highly effective and commendable.

The following is a summary of the tests made and results thereof during the season 1943-1944:

The small number of samples found to contain stimulants is a splendid testimonial of the preventative work done by these officials in this phase of supervision of racing by your Commission.

The Florida State Racing Commission expresses its appreciation of the cooperation it has received from racing associations during the year, and for their compliance with regulations of governmental agencies in the matter of transportation and saving of essential war materials.

The Commission has maintained a careful check of each of the race track associations to see that they have complied with the provision of the law which requires that 85% of all persons, except racing officials, employed at the race tracks, shall be citizens and residents of the State of Florida. Each of said associations has adhered strictly to the law in employing qualified Florida citizens and residents during their race meeting.

Members of the press have been very fair and cooperative in reporting the activities of racing in Florida and this attitude and assistance has contributed greatly to the success of racing during the past season.

The total attendance and the total amount wagered at the tracks and at the Fronton during the past season were as follows:

The total revenue from the tax on attendance and pari-mutuel wagering during the past season was the greatest in the history of racing in Florida. It amounted to \$6,794,336.79, in contrast to the total revenue of \$4,360,665.68 in the previous high season, 1941-1942. That year is taken for comparison because it was the first season in which the 5% tax on pari-mutuel pools conducted at horse tracks in Florida was imposed and because the 1942-1943 season does not afford a fair comparison, racing in that season having been greatly curtailed on account of travel restrictions. However, the total attendance at the horse and dog tracks and at the Jai-Alai Fronton during the season just closed was less than during the 1941-1942 season. In that respect racing is still adversely affected by war conditions. The increased revenue resulted from heavier wagering.

In the following tables will be found more detailed statements of attendance and amounts wagered, and revenue from the tax thereon at the various horse and dog tracks and at the Jai-Alai Fronton. Not only has the total revenue from racing in Florida been higher during the last season than ever before, but the cost of operation has been lower than in any previous year. Total expenditures for all State activities in connection with racing amounted to only 2.65% of the total amount of revenue collected. The average cost of operation for the three seasons during this administration, including the season 1942-1943, when the cost was proportionately high on account of curtailed operation and reduced revenue, is 4.19% of the average amount of total revenue for said years. This compares very fayorably with the previous all-time average cost of operation of 10.96%.

Racing in Florida is primarily an attraction for out-of-state visitors, who contribute most of the revenue. No other source of taxation in Florida results in such substantial revenue to the State with so little imposition on its own citizens. This is an important source of revenue to the people of every community in the State, and racing affords an attraction to many tourists who find in it the type of entertainment they want. For these reasons racing should be fostered in every way legitimately practicable.

The Commission has been mindful of the recreational advantages of racing in the war program, and has exerted its best efforts to so conduct racing as to contribute to the entertainment and morale of our armed forces.

The Commission has been diligent in its supervision of racing. It has striven to increase the revenue from racing and at the same time promote public confidence in the sport. The Commission has been fully aware of the fact that while the amount of revenue from racing necessarily fluctuates with the amount of money wagered at the tracks, there is every indication that the continued improvement in the quality of racing contributes directly to increased revenue. So the Commission has been vigilant in detecting and eradicating bookmaking and other deleterious practices, and has fully and carefully exercised its supervisory jurisdiction in all other respects in the conduct of racing. It is the belief of the Commission that bookmaking has been greatly curtailed through its efforts, and that due to its surveillance the infraction of rules of racing has been almost eliminated. The Commission points with pride to its efficient record of clean and economical administration of racing. Here again the Commission wants to express its appreciation to the racing associations for their cooperation in the conduct of racing on a high plane.

While the Commission has strictly and rigidly enforced the statutes and rules pertaining to racing it has been fair in its dealings with all interested persons. Appeals and hearings have been freely granted to those charged with violations of the racing laws and rules, and no penalty has been imposed or sustained without due consideration of all the facts presented or ascertained.




