ATTENDANCE AND PLAY

During the fiscal year covered by this report the eighteen operators subject to the supervision of this Commission operated a total of 1,377 racing or playing days. Of this total number of days, the horse tracks operated 170 days, dog tracks 1,117 days and the Jai Alai Fronton 90 days, and these activities attracted a total paid attendance of 4,539,742 patrons, who wagered \$178,842,858.00.

While there was a decrease in attendance of 2.18% for all activities under the preceding fiscal year, pari-mutuel wagering showed a slight increase of .377% over the previous year. Dog tracks and the Jai Alai Fronton experienced both a decrease in attendance and pari-mutuel wagering, while horse tracks showed a slight increase in both attendance and wagering. This may be accounted for by the fact that greyhound racing and Jai Alai exhibitions operated 17 days less than the previous year, while horse tracks operated 10 days more, and in addition thereto, the Commission authorized and the horse tracks conducted more thoroughbred races than the previous year, as well as quarter horse races, which were authorized by the 1949 Legislature. We would also like to note that the general trend of attendance and pari-mutuel wagering in other states, as a whole, reflected a decrease.

STATE INCOME FROM RACING

The total revenue to the State for the current fiscal year from pari-mutuel wagering, admissions and kindred taxes aggregated \$13,101,521.89, which is a slight decrease of less than one per cent (.915%) under the previous fiscal year. As has hereinbefore been stated, that wagering increased slightly (.377%) over the previous year, it would appear that the income to the State should also reflect an increase. This is not necessarily true, because wagering did not increase at all types of wagering events, and then, too, we experienced a general decrease in attendance of 2.18%. Pari-mutuel wagering increased at horse tracks (2.83%), but decreased at dog tracks (1.48%) and Jai Alai Fronton (15.8%), as well as attendance decreasing at dog tracks (1.92%) and Jai Alai Fronton (14.3%), while attendance at horse tracks showed a slight increase of less than one per cent (.372%).

Income to the State is derived primarily from the State's commission on the volume of pari-mutuel wagering, but its income from admission taxes is dependent upon the attendance rather than the volume of wager-

ing. In the present instance, the decrease in income to the State was mainly due to the provisions of law (Chapters 25257 and 26334, Laws 1949), permitting the Pensacola Kennel Club (dog track) and Sunshine Park (horse track) to pay a flat daily license fee of \$500.00 and \$4,000.00, respectively, in lieu of the existing 5% commission at dog tracks and 8% at horse tracks of the pari-mutuel sales, which resulted in the State receiving \$211,500.00, rather than \$431,109.37 which the State would have normally received. This reflects a reduction in income to the State of \$219,609.37, but the State, however, still benefited without reduction on income from admissions and other miscellaneous taxes at these two tracks. Both of these tracks had been experiencing financial distress and loss and the Legislature saw fit to enact the flat daily license fee law in order to keep the tracks in existence and operating and thus realize some revenue from pari-mutuel wagering, admissions and other taxes, which would have been completely lost to the State upon the failure of such tracks to continue operations under the existing percentage commissions.

Of the aggregate amount of income received by the State during the period covered by this report, only 2.12% was expended by this Commission in connection with its year-round activities in carrying out and enforcing the provisions of the State racing laws and its rules and regulations. The average administrative cost for controlling and supervising racing and the collecting of the State's revenue has, for the past nineteen years, averaged approximately 4%. It can readily be seen that revenue derived from this source compares most favorably with any other State revenue, insofar as expense of collection, supervision and policing may be concerned.

The various licensed operators received, as their share from pari-mutuel wagering, \$17,225,898.49, exclusive, however, of income derived from concessions, parking, admission sales, etc., and there was distributed to the public as awards from winning pari-mutuel tickets \$149,144,482.00, which amounts reflect slight increases over the previous year.

Each of the 67 counties in this State received, as their proportionate share, \$82,400.00, which is an equal amount as received by each county in the previous year and is greatly in excess of the \$33,000.00 guaranteed to each county by law.

There was paid into the Old Age Assistance Fund the sum of \$7,111,124.78, as its share of income from racing, which amount reflected a slight decrease of 1.8% under the previous year.

Detailed figures and statements covering the current fiscal year are hereafter included in this report, relating to the attendance, pari-mutuel sales, taxes paid and the amount distributed to the public by the individual racing associations, together with receipts and disbursements by this Commission, as well as other information relating to the officers and operations of the various associations.

RACING A SUBSTANTIAL INDUSTRY

During the past nineteen years racing in Florida has grown from a small seasonal activity to a substantial year-round commercial enterprise.

Apart from the entertainment feature offered by racing, it attracts thousands of visitors to our State, as well as providing substantial revenue

to the State; employment to many Florida citizens and beneficial income and profits to local business in the sale of food, feed, medications and other service rendered the thousands of horses and greyhounds connected with racing, as well as sales and service rendered to the many owners, trainers, jockeys and other persons directly and indirectly connected with the sport, while residing in this State.

A brief review of racing in Florida, by comparing the first official racing season of 1931-32 with the current season of 1949-50, will affirmatively reflect the great progress and success which racing has experienced in Florida.

During the period covered by this report your Commission supervised the operations of eighteen permit holders consisting of four horse tracks, thirteen dog tracks and one Jai-Alai Fronton. During the 1931-32 season there were half as many operators, consisting of three horse tracks and six dog tracks, and these nine operators expended a total of 462 racing days as compared with 1,377 racing and playing days expended by the various operators during the 1949-50 season.

During the initial racing season of 1931-32, this sport attracted a total paid attendance of 1,157,161 patrons, who wagered \$17,365,424.00, from which operations the State derived as revenue the sum of \$737,300.70. The 1949-50 season had a total paid attendance of 4,539,742 patrons (392.3% increase), who wagered \$178,842,858.00 (1029.8% increase), with the State deriving a total aggregate revenue of \$13,101,521.89 (1776.9% increase).

The amount of persons employed directly by the various operators has practically doubled in number, over the past nineteen years. During the season covered by this report the various operators employed 5,128 persons and paid these employees \$4,116,621.07, and of this number 85% were citizens of Florida, who are benefited and protected by the requirement of the 1941 law that 85% of track employees must be bona fide citizens of Florida and must be paid a like percentage of the total payroll. During the 1931-32 season the various operators directly employed 2,778 persons, who did not have the benefit and protection of the 1941 law, requiring that 85% of the track employees be bona fide citizens and residents of Florida, and paid a like percentage of the total payroll.

Today racing in Florida is not seasonal, but is authorized and conducted during the entire year, while during the 1931-32 season racing was authorized for only four months, during December, January, February and March. Thus racing has become a year-round, substantial business and today Florida is regarded as the nation's foremost racing center.

COMMISSION LABORATORY

The Racing Commission maintains a toxicology laboratory in Miami, Florida, which is under the supervision of Dr. Elsie S. Bellows, Ph.D., who serves as Chief Chemist for the Racing Commission and is a recognized authority and expert in this field.

The laboratory analyzed approximately 5,000 samples of horse and dog urine and saliva, as well as several miscellaneous samples of blood, bracers, syringes, needles, etc., to determine whether any animal had been

improperly stimulated or depressed prior to a race. Only four of such samples, three horse and one dog, were found to be positive for stimulants, which indicates that this effective method of detection has practically deterred this improper and unlawful method of affecting the results of a race.

In addition, the Commission laboratory has analyzed 145 samples of urine and saliva of horses competing at foreign tracks in Cuba and Nassau, at a charge of \$10.00 per specimen.

PERMITS AND TRANSFERS

Granted

Pursuant to an Order of the Florida Supreme Court (20 So. 2d, 258), the Racing Commission granted the Daytona Jockey Club Association a conditional permit to conduct horse racing in Volusia County, which permit has been ratified by local option election held in said County on the 11th day of July, 1950. Within twelve months from said date of ratification the permit holder must construct a track, suitable to conduct horse racing, or the permit is subject to be cancelled.

Cancelled

Pursuant to Chapter 17276, Laws of 1935, and the interpretation placed thereon by the Supreme Court of Florida (42 So. 2d, 87) and Chapter 25242, Laws of 1949, the Racing Commission cancelled the dog racing permit of Six-Mile Creek Kennel Club, Inc. (Hillsborough County), for its failure to conduct racing within the time required by law. The action of the Commission in cancelling said permit is now on appeal in the United States Supreme Court.

Transfer

The untimely death of H. L. Straus, President of Gables Racing Association, in October, 1949, took from the scene of racing one of its outstanding and capable leaders.

The estate of the late H. L. Straus has sold the controlling stock ownership in the Gables Racing Association, Inc., (Tropical Park) to Nathan E. Herzfeld and Alfred O. Hoyt of New York, and the necessary details of the transfer of ownership are now being completed.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 25258, Laws of 1949, known as the "Scholarship Fund", authorizing any race track in this state to apply for and the Racing Commission to grant an additional day of racing for the purpose of creating and providing state scholarships from the profits derived therefrom, the race tracks consenting thereto and operating the additional day, paid into the fund the generous sum of \$165,830.00. These moneys are administered and supervised by the State Board of Control and are made available to worthy students attending state institutions of higher learning.

THOROUGHBRED BREEDING IN FLORIDA

The breeding and raising of thoroughbred race horses in Florida has met with much progress and success. There is a total of eighteen thoroughbred nursery farms in this State, situated in Marion, Broward, Dade,

Duval, Osceola and Nassau Counties, where racing stock is now being produced. Twenty stallions and ninety-four mares are registered with the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders Association.

National attention was focused on Florida breeding in May, 1950, when Fair Game won the Bay State Kindergarten at Suffolk Downs, and five days later Liberty Rab won the Juvenile at Belmont Park. Fair Game and Liberty Rab, both two-year olds, were foaled at Rosemere Farm, Marion County and Christopher Ranch, Dade County, respectively. Liberty Rab was the world's leading money winning juvenile for a period of several weeks during the spring.

Of the special races this year for Florida-breds, A. B. Christopher's Mr. A. B. won the \$7,500.00 Florida Breeders' Stake at Hialeah, and Mrs. Christopher's Liberty Rab won the Florida-Cuban Invitational race for two-year-olds at Gulfstream.

For the first six months of 1950 Florida-bred race horses won a total of \$154,357.00, with 69 firsts, 70 seconds, 56 thirds and 64 fourths. Victories for Florida-breds were recorded at the major eastern and middle western tracks.

CONCLUSION

Your Commission has maintained its affiliation with the National Association of State Racing Commissioners. This organization is made up from the membership of Racing Commissions from all of the States of the United States which have authorized pari-mutuel wagering and includes membership from Canada, Cuba and Mexico. At the national convention held in Mexico City on February 5-12, 1950, your Commission was represented by its Secretary, B. P. Beville, who again invited the National Association to hold its 1951 annual convention in Miami, Florida, which invitation was accepted by a unanimous vote of the convention and will be held in Miami January 21-25, 1951. By the large number of reservations that are being requested by the delegates of the National Association we are assured the largest representation at any convention held by the National Association of State Racing Commissions. Your acceptance of our invitation to extend Florida's address of welcome to the convention is sincerely and gratefully appreciated by your Commission.

At the convention in Mexico City, Leo Edwards, Chairman of this Commission, was elected First Vice-President of the National Association and B. P. Beville, Commission Secretary, and Commissioners Ralph L. Crum, Roy Patience and Percy O. Corbin were each appointed on important committees of the Association.

Your Commission has been diligent in its supervision of racing, and with the cooperation of other agencies, has exercised strict control and supervision of racing activities. We shall, in protecting the public and state interests, be just and fair in the exercise of our authority and keep racing upon a high plane so that it will always merit the confidence of the public.
