ATTENDANCE AND PLAY

During the period covered by this report the Commission supervised and directed the operations of eighteen duly licensed pari-mutuel plants, consisting of thirteen dog tracks, four horse tracks and one jaialai fronton. The aforesaid seventeen tracks and fronton operated a total of 1,378 days, exclusive of the additional day granted to and conducted by the various licensees in behalf of the Board of Control for State educational scholarships. Of this total number of racing and playing days, the horse tracks operated 162 days, the dog tracks 1,116 days and jai-alai fronton 100 days. The activities of the eighteen operators attracted a total paid attendance of 4,643,293 patrons who wagered a total of \$204,385,597.00. A comparison with the preceding 1949-1950 season, which had a total paid attendance of 4,539,742 patrons, who wagered \$178,842,858.00 during 1,377 racing and playing days, reflects an in-

crease in paid attendance of 103,551 persons, or 2.28%, and an increase in dollars wagered of \$25,542,739.00, or 14.28%. An increase in attendance and wagering was experienced by each of the operators, although the total number of playing or racing days increased by only one day. The dog tracks and jai-alai fronton operated a total of 1,216 days, as compared with 1,207 days last season, being an increase of 9 days, while the horse tracks operated 162 days, as compared with 170 days the preceding season, being a decrease of 8 days. The dog tracks and jai-alai fronton experienced, over the preceding year, an attendance increase of 83,085 patrons, or 2.58% and \$6,924,231.00 in wagering, or 8.23%, while horse tracks increased their attendance by 20,466 more persons, or 1.55%, and wagering by \$18,618,508.00 or 19.65%.

It is significant to note that the greatest portion of increase in attendance, and particularly in wagering, was experienced by the various operators in the lower East coast where the three horse tracks' pari-mutuel play increased, over the period of the previous season, by \$18,509,609.00, and the five dog tracks and fronton in said area reflect an increase in wagering, over the period of the previous season by \$4,530,399.00, or a total increase in wagering of \$23,040,008.00, which represents over 90% of the total \$25,542,739.00 increase in wagering at all tracks and fronton in this State. This increase in wagering is directly accountable to the increased number of winter visitors in Florida during the 1950-51 tourist season, together with the efforts of this administration and other agencies in suppressing bookmaking on and off the tracks. The growth and development of Greater Miami area likewise contributed to the increase in attendance and play.

Attached hereto and made a part of this report are detailed figures, statements and comparative data covering the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, relating to the receipts and disbursements of this Commission, attendance, pari-mutuel wagering, taxes paid to the State, amounts distributed to the public by each individual racing association, and other information relative to the operations of each association.

STATE INCOME

The State realized nearly fifteen million dollars (\$14,997,486.10) in revenue from racing during the fiscal year covered by this report, which amount represents an increase in income to the State over the preceding fiscal year of 14.47%, or an increase in dollars of \$1,895,964.21. Of the aggregate amount received by the State, only 2.24% was expended by this Commission in connection with all its year-round activities in directing, supervising and controlling racing in this State. The average cost in administering the racing laws, for the past nineteen years, has averaged approximately 4%. Insofar as the cost of administering racing is concerned, it compares most favorably with any other State agency or department.

Each of the 67 counties received, as their proportionate share of income from racing, \$92,500.00, which is an increase of \$10,100.00 received by each county during the previous year and is greatly in excess of the \$33,000.00 guaranteed to each county by law. In addition thereto,

the Old Age Assistance Fund received, as its share of income from racing, the sum of \$8,264,329.77, which amount reflects an increase of \$1,153, 204.99 over the previous year.

COMMISSION LABORATORY

Dr. Elsie S. Bellows, Ph.D., a recognized authority and expert in the field of chemistry, serves as Chief Chemist for this Commission and supervises the toxicology laboratory maintained by this Commission in Miami, Florida. During the period covered by this report our laboratory, under the supervision of Dr. Bellows, analyzed more than 5,000 samples of horse and dog urine and saliva, as well as miscellaneous samples of feed, needles, syringes and bracers, to determine whether any animal had been improperly stimulated or depressed prior to a race. Only one of such samples, a dog, was found to be positive for stimulants, which is a splendid testimonial of the preventive work and careful supervision of the employees and officials under the direction of this Commission, as well as indicating that this unlawful method of affecting the results of a race is rarely used in this State.

In addition to the analysis made of specimens taken from animals competing at tracks in this State, the Commission laboratory, at the request of the horse track in Havana, Cuba, analyzed 165 samples of urine and saliva of horses competing in Cuba, at a charge of \$10.00 per sample.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 25258, Laws of 1949, commonly known as the "Scholarship Fund" authorizing any race track to apply for and the Racing Commission to grant an additional day of racing for the purpose of creating and providing scholarships to attend Florida institutions of higher learning in this State from the profits derived therefrom, the race tracks consenting thereto and operating the additional day paid into the fund the sum of \$247,260.75. This amount represents an increase over the previous racing season in the amount of \$81,430.75. The aforesaid fund is administered by the State Board of Control and is made available to worthy students attending State institutions of higher learning.

THOROUGHBRED BREEDING IN FLORIDA

There are eighteen thoroughbred nursery farms in Florida, in Marion, Broward, Dade, Duval, Osceola and Nassau Counties, where thoroughbred racing stock is being produced. These "cracker" horses have proved themselves the equal in size, appearance, stamina, soundness and speed, of the horses from such famous breeding states as Kentucky, Virginia and Maryland. The first Florida-bred horse to win at a recognized track, Bel Air, Maryland, on June 30, 1939, was Martha's Queen, bred by James H. Bright and produced in Broward County. That year "cracker" horses won a total of \$675.00 in purses. In 1949, ten years later, Florida-bred earnings totaled \$188,072.50 and in 1950 the earnings increased to \$284,455.00. The anticipated earnings for the current year will run close to \$400,000.00.

LEGISLATION

During the 1951 session of the Legislature there were passed and became a law the following Acts relating to racing:

CHAPTER 26485—reinstated certain ratified permits for harness horse racing, extended the time for constructing race tracks by such permit holders, fixed the season and time for conducting such harness races and the commission payable from pari-mutuel pools.

CHAPTER 26722—regulates the transmission of horse racing infor mation by restricting the time within which information may not be transmitted from a horse track, viz: one hour prior to the first race and thirty minutes between races and not less than fifteen minutes after the last race.

CHAPTER 26832—prohibits and disqualifies certain classes of persons from having an interest in a racing permit or being connected with a racing permit holder, and providing for suspension or revocation of permit for violation thereof. This law becomes effective July 1, 1952.

CHAPTER 26850—provides that the records of the State Racing Commission shall be open for inspection to certain officials and provides penalties.

CHAPTER 26873—extends the time for construction of horse race tracks by holders of ratified permits where the location of the horse track is East of the Apalachicola River.

PERMITS

GRANTED:

The Monro Operating Company, Inc., a Florida corporation, was granted a permit to conduct and operate a jai-alai fronton in Broward County.

REINSTATED:

Pursuant to Chapter 26485, Laws of 1951, the Ponce De Leon Raceway Association permit to conduct harness horse racing in St. Johns County, heretofore cancelled by the Racing Commission for failure to construct a race track as provided in Section 550.06, Florida Statutes, 1941, was reinstated by the Legislature of Florida and the time for constructing a track was extended for a period of twelve months from the time Federal restrictions on construction of race tracks are removed.

TRANSFERS:

The Commission, after investigation, authorized the following transfers:

Permit issued and held by John W. Kane and C. C. "Milo" Vega, Jr., as co-partners and co-holders for horse racing in Hillsborough County, to Sunshine Park Racing Association, Inc., a Florida corporation.

Controlling stock ownership in Volusia County Kennel Club, Inc., a Florida corporation conducting dog racing in Volusia County, owned and held by D. C. Coleman, W. L. Huntley, Sr., W. L. Huntley, Jr., and Roy Partin to Jerry Collins, L. M. Kirkpatrick and W. L. Kirkpatrick.

Controlling stock ownership in Palm Beach Kennel Club, Inc., a Florida corporation, conducting dog racing in Palm Beach County, owned and held by J. Stockton Bryan and Phil Bryan, to Edward D. Latimer, Berlin Griffin and Arthur Pierson, Jr.

LITIGATION

An appeal to the United States Supreme Court from the judgment of the Supreme Court of Florida (45 So.2d, 876), upholding an order of the Racing Commission cancelling the dog racing permit of the Six-Mile Creek Kennel Club, Inc., was dismissed. (71 Sup.Ct. 69).

There is now pending in the Supreme Court of Florida an appeal by the Broward County Kennel Club, Inc., from an order of the Circuit Court of Broward County upholding the authority of the Racing Commission to grant the Monro Operating Company, Inc., a permit to conduct a jai-alai fronton in Broward County.

AUDIT

During the fiscal year covered by this report the Commission instituted an investigation to determine the true ownership of stock in, and whether political contributions had been made by any racing permit holders in this state, in violation of the racing laws. The Commission employed H. E. Moore of Tallahassee to audit the records of the various associations and his report is expected to be filed with the Commission within the next few weeks.

MISCELLANEOUS

There were 339 persons ejected from the various tracks for bookmaking, touting and kindred offenses.

The Commission adopted, in the face of much opposition and criticism, the "20-minute delay rule," which rule prohibited the transmission of racing information from within any track for a period of 20 minutes after each race. The effect of this rule was to cripple bookmaking and its soundness was manifested by the 1951 Legislature enacting a law similar to the rule.

CONCLUSION

As heretofore, and in detail hereafter shown, no other source of taxation in this State results in such substantial income to Florida with so little imposition on its citizens as racing, as well as attracting many visitors and other persons connected with racing to our State; consequently, racing should be fostered in every way legitimately practical.

We, the present members of your Commission, wish to express our appreciation for the confidence and trust you have reposed in us to administer racing and we pledge to you and the people of this State our loyalty and best efforts. We shall, in protecting the public and State in-

terests, be just and fair in the exercise of our authority and shall strive to keep racing upon a high plane so that it will always merit the confidence of the public.

The success of our administration of racing has been and will be largely due to the loyalty and diligence of those persons employed by this Commission to carry out its functions. We wish to express our appreciation to the various employees who have assisted us and particularly are we grateful to Mr. Robert Kelly, Supervisor of Racing; Mrs. Inez Martin, Office Secretary; Mr. Irving Harrington, Office Auditor; Mrs. Myrtis Turner, License Clerk; Mrs. Jessie Flegal, Payroll Clerk; Dr. Elsie Bellows, Ph.D., Chief Chemist; Dr. E. D. Clawson, Chief Veterinarian; and Mr. Charles Nelson and Mr. F. G. (Pug) Wilson, Stewards at the horse tracks, who each merit our confidence and exhibited the ability and qualifications required by their respective positions.
