





SCOPE OF RACING IN FLORIDA

Some idea of the extent to which our State has developed as racing center since the Legislature authorized pari-mutuel wagering in 1931 can be gained by reference to the annual statistics tabulated in Exhibit "A" of this report. This progress has been marked by steady increases in attendance and revenue to the State each year except during the period of World War II.

During the twenty-three years, more than seventy million persons have attended the races and exhibitions in Florida and their wagers have amounted to approximately two billion, six hundred and thirteen million dollars. This has produced approximately one hundred seventy-three million dollars of revenue for the State, exclusive of the amounts produced on "Scholarship" and "Charity" days.

The manner in which the revenue from racing has been allocated by direction of the Legislature is summarized also in Exhibit "A".

ATTENDANCE AND PLAY

During the period covered by this report the Commission supervised and directed the operations of 22 duly licensed pari-mutuel plants, consisting of 14 dog tracks, four horse tracks, one harness track, and 3 jai-alai frontons. However, the harness track, Ponce de Leon Raceway, Inc., failed to actively operate. The aforesaid 14 tracks and 3 frontons operated a total of 1,552 days, exclusive of the additional days granted to and conducted by the various licensees in behalf of the Board of Control for State educational scholarships, Charities, etc. Of this total number of racing and playing days, the horse tracks operated 170 days, the dog tracks 1266 days and jai-alai frontons 286 days. The activities of the 21 operators attracted a total paid attendance of 5,812,577 patrons who wagered a total of \$276,681,999.00. A comparison with the preceding 1952-53 season, which had a total paid attendance of 5,732,369 patrons, who wagered \$272,695,059.00 during 1,549 racing and playing days, reflects an increase in paid attendance of 80,208 persons, or 1.40%, and an increase in dollars wagered of \$3,985,940.00, or 1.46%. An increase in attendance and wagering was experienced by most of the operators. The dog tracks and jai-alai frontons operated a total of 1,552 days, as compared with 1,344 days last season, being an increase of 208 days, while the horse tracks operated 170 days, as compared with 205 days the preceding season, being a decrease of 35 days. Harness track did not operate. The dog tracks and jai-alai frontons experienced, over the preceding year an attendance increase of 182,767 patrons, or 4.54% and \$2,464,765.00 in wagering, or 2.01%, while horse tracks decreased their attendance by 102,559 less persons, or 6.03%, and wagering increased by \$1,521,175.00 or 1.01%.

The 67 Counties of this State each received, as their proportionate share, the sum of \$125,100.00 which amount represents an increase of \$2,300.00 or 1.87% more than received by each county during the previous season and is greatly in excess of the \$33,000.00 guaranteed to each county by law.

The Old Age Assistance Fund also experienced an increase. Its share of income amounted to \$10,989,841.96 which amount is 1.40%

or \$151,294.11 more than was paid into the Old Age Assistance Fund during the previous season. Of the aggregate amount of \$20,026,021.78 collected by your Commission during the current season from all racing activities, only 2.00% was expended by your Commission in connection with its year-round activities in controlling, directing and supervising the operation and activities of the various licensed operators. It is evident that the revenue derived from racing compares most favorably with any other source of State revenue, particularly as the expense of collecting, supervising and policing is concerned.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 25258, Acts of 1949, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate a total of 19 additional days of racing during the past year for the purpose of creating and providing State Scholarships from the profits derived therefrom. A total of \$280,506.70 was derived for this worthy purpose and remitted to the State Board of Control for Institutions of Higher Learning.

In addition, the Commission, in compliance with Chapter 28499, Acts of 1953, authorized the applicable tracks and fronton in Hillsborough County, to operate a total of 3 additional days for the benefit of the University of Tampa, from which said University derived the sum of \$16,442.05 to be used for scholarships for worthy students.

CHARITY DAYS

In conformance with Chapter 20843, Acts of 1941, whereby the operators of the various tracks and frontons are permitted to apply for an additional day wherein the net proceeds are to be contributed to charities of their choice, subject to a provision designating the University of Miami as a charitable institution entitled to 25 percent of the day's profits. Permission was granted by the Commission for the operation of 4 such days during the year as a result of which \$165,165.02 was realized by the University of Miami for scholarships for worthy students.

PERMITS GRANTED

Gandy Operating Company, Hillsborough County, a new permit issued on July 11, 1953 to replace permit issued August 9, 1952.

Monro Operating Company, Broward County, a new permit issued July 11, 1953 to replace permit issued July 29, 1952.

LITIGATION

The following litigation had been instituted prior to this year but decisions were entered therein during the current year namely:

OWEN B. McMANUS, etc., Plaintiff, vs. FLORIDA STATE RAC-ING COMMISSION et al; and MONRO OPERATING CO., INC., a Florida corporation, Defendants, No. 18964 in the Circuit Court of Broward County, Florida, in which the Plaintiff was seeking a declaratory decree construing sections 550.05, 550.06, 551.12 F.S.A. and such other sections as may have been pertinent to determine the effectiveness of the fronton permit then held by MONRO OPERATING CO., INC., and the validity of any operating license which may have been issued pursuant thereto. The lower Court rendered a decree upholding the contention of the Commission.

STATE OF FLORIDA ex rel FRONTON EXHIBITION COM-PANY, a Florida corporation, Relator, vs. CURTIS A. HAGGARD, et al, as the Florida State Racing Commission, Respondents, being No. 24,073 in the Supreme Court of Florida, concerning the issuance by the Racing Commission of a permit to MONRO OPERATING CO., INC. to operate a fronton in Broward County, Florida. This was likewise decided in favor of the Commission.

STATE OF FLORIDA ex rel GULFSTREAM PARK RACING ASSOCIATION, INC., a Florida corporation, Relator, vs. FLORIDA STATE RACING COMMISSION, et al, Respondents, being in the Supreme Court of Florida, on the petition of Relator for an Alternative Writ of Mandamus in connection with scholarship days granted to race tracks. This decision was resolved partly in favor of the Commission's contention and partly contra thereto.

VOLUSIA COUNTY KENNEL CLUB, INC., et al, Plaintiffs, vs. CURTIS A. HAGGARD, et al, as and constituting the Florida State Racing Commission, Defendant, in the Circuit Court of the Second Judicial Circuit in and for Leon County, Florida, involving the increase in dog track taxes. No. 12,992. The Florida Supreme Court held this tax to be illegal and the matter was appealed to the United States Supreme Court and had not been decided as of the date of this report.

LABORATORY

The Florida State Racing Commission Laboratory effectively executes its responsibility in the regulation of racing by its recognized control of doping of race horses and greyhounds. The malpractice of drugging racing animals for the purpose of affecting the racing performance of

the animal is kept at a minimum by the highly sensitive detection methods employed by the Racing Commission Laboratory which has been under the directorship of Dr. Elsie S. Bellows for the past nine years, who is recognized nationally for her outstanding work in this field.

Dr. Bellows reports that for the fiscal year of July 1, 1953 through June 30, 1954, a total of 7,666 Florida racing samples were analyzed microchemically for the presence of illegal drugs. This total represents 3,129 saliva and urine samples from the four horse tracks, 4,485 urine samples from the fourteen greyhound tracks, 25 miscellaneous suspected items such as syringes, medicines, etc., confiscated from stables and 27 miscellaneous experimental analyses. In addition, in the interests of clean racing, the Laboratory performed 410 analyses (at \$10 per sample) for three Caribbean Racing Boards who expressed enthusiastic appreciation of the work done for them by the Racing Laboratory.

A total of 11 positives was reported by Dr. Bellows to the appropriate Commission. Six positives were within the Florida jurisdiction and five were found in the foreign tracks. The effectiveness of the control and the deterrent action of the laboratory can be observed from the positive doping data just cited: of 7,666 Florida samples, only 6 were positive for illegal drugs; as contrast to this excellent record, of 410 foreign samples analyzed, 5 were positive for illegal drugs.

This summer the Laboratory underwent badly needed physical renovation which included a refinishing of the floors and walls, electric, plumbing and carpentry repairs, temperature and humidity control of that laboratory area in which these two factors influence the sensitivity of the detection methods.

INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

The Commission operates an Investigative Division under the direction of Bill D. Clark.

The first responsibility of this division is to promote and correlate the law enforcement program of the racing industry in this state. The division and its program is designed with the best interest of racing and of the people in mind. The Investigative Division has endeavored to work very closely with other law enforcement agencies. The interchange of information, records and ideas has proven a great asset for law enforcement in the racing industry.

The Commission would like to commend the track managements, track police departments, local and state law enforcement agencies for their splendid cooperation in the law enforcement field. This cooperation and constructive working arrangement has accomplished much in promoting the best interest of racing. The Commission also acknowledges other groups, such as the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, Inc., and the Pinkerton National Detective Agency, for the assistance they have offered in this field.

It is with the cooperation of the above law enforcement agencies, who have a direct interest in racing, that we are able to immediately initiate an investigation of bookmaking activities, illegal dissemination of racing information, stimulation of horses and greyhounds, and of other violations.

The Investigative Division is charged with the responsibility of the enforcement of the law commonly referred to as the 85 Per Cent Law. This law requires each association to employ Florida residents to the extent of at least 85% of the total number employed and they must receive a minimum of 85% of the total wages paid all employees.

Rules of the Florida State Racing Commission require the fingerprinting and photographing of all persons employed by each association, the holder of any permit, including all officials and directors. The Investigative Division is charged with this function. Approximately 14,000 occupational licenses were issued last year. Of this amount 1,953 were new employees and fingerprints of these individuals were submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a check of the background and criminal record. In many instances, local, state and other law enforcement agencies were requested to furnish similar information.

Of these 1,953 new employees fingerprinted last year, 27 were found to have been convicted of a felony. Approximately 100 felonies were reported during the 1952-1953 season. This substantial decrease of individuals found to possess criminal records indicates the effectiveness of this program. This number should be decreased each succeeding year.

The Investigative Division and the various track police departments were instrumental in the ejection of approximately 273 bookmakers, touts and other undesirables during the 1953-1954 racing season.

It is the responsibility of the Investigative Division to keep the members of the Racing Commission informed of any and all matters in which the Racing Commission has an interest.

FLORIDA BRED HORSES

Florida has for years been one of the leaders in the cattle industry. Today there is a new industry—the breeding and raising of Thoroughbred Race Horses.

In 1946, a small group organized the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders Association. This group was composed of James H. Bright, Hunter Lyon, Stephan Zachar, C. A. O'Neil, Jr., Tillyu Christopher, Dr. George Wollard, Dr. B. F. Whitten, Dr. J. H. Yarborough, H. H. Horn and David Nossek.

Today this industry has grown into a large organization with over thirty breeding farms and over fifty breeders with investments in the millions.

The Florida Bred is rapidly being recognized nation-wide. Their winnings in purses are over \$2,000,000.00 since the organization began, and approximately one-half million in 1954. Much of the credit of this industry's swift growth is due to the splendid cooperation of the race tracks and the Florida State Racing Commission and the efforts of Robert Kelly, the State Supervisor of Racing.

The farms are located in various parts of the state; the two largest, located in Ocala, are owned and operated by Carl Rose and one by William Leach. C. A. O'Neil and Tillyu Christopher operate in Dade County and their farms are something to be proud of. There are many other

farms in the state to be proud of and who knows—someday Florida may produce another "Native Dancer."

MISCELLANEOUS

This Commission initiated a new method of issuing occupational licenses and greyhound registrations. Remington-Rand equipment has been installed and such licenses and registrations are now issued through the use of these machines: key punch, interpreter, sorter, reproducer and tabulator.

Through the use of these machines, occupational licenses and grey-hound registrations are now issued direct from the office of the Florida State Racing Commission. This procedure enables the Commission to have a complete and accurate report on all licenses and registrations issued, and of monies received from said items.

By the use of the Remington-Rand machines, the Commission office now has the direct control of personnel and of the procedure of issuing licenses and registrations.

The Commission believes this method is the foundation for the modernization of such procedures in the racing industry.

NATIONAL COORDINATION

The members of the Commission are members of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners and participate in its programs and committee activities. Under a policy of reciprocity, a State racing authority's denial of privileges to a person in its State operates to deny such privilege to such person in any other State until the denial has been removed by the original authority.

Florida was represented at the National meeting of the Association by Chairman Ray E. Dilg and Millard G. Gilmore, members of the Racing Commission, Commission Attorney Robert H. Carlton, Chief Investigator Bill D. Clark and Chief Chemist Elsie S. Bellows. It is felt that the contacts established there will prove to be of inestimable value in the work of this Commission.

At this convention, Chairman Ray E. Dilg was requested by the President of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners to be Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Association.

ADMINISTRATION

The Commission maintains an office at 911 Security Building, Miami, Florida. The entire State racing business is handled through this office. The able and faithful staff has been directed since 1941 by a recognized authority in the field of racing, Mr. Robert Kelly, Supervisor of Racing.

The auditing, accounting and statistical functions of the Commission have been under the supervision of Mr. Irving Harrington, Office Auditor, since 1943.

The Commission Laboratory has been under the directorship of Dr. Elsie Bellows for the past nine years. Dr. Bellows is recognized nationally for her outstanding work in this field.

We wish to commend and express our appreciation not only to the above named persons, but to all those employed by the Commission to carry out its mandates and functions. These include Bill D. Clark, Chief Investigator; Mrs. Myrtis Turner, Office Secretary; Mrs. Dorothy Griffin, Secretary; Miss Gladys Simmons, Payroll Clerk and Stenographer; Mrs. Ann Gordon, Comptometer Operator and Typist; Mrs. Johnnie Reynolds, Secretary to the Investigator, and Miss Kay B. Camuse, Key Punch Operator.

Others not previously mentioned who have represented the Commission well are Dr. C. E. Dee, Chief Veterinarian, the State Stewards at the horse tracks, John J. McLaughlin, George Canova and Tom J. Landrum.

CONCLUSION

Again, the Commission would like to call attention to the fact that no other source of taxation in this state results in such substantial income to Florida with so little imposition on its citizens as does racing. In addition, racing attracts untold numbers of visitors to our state, and in our opinion it should continue to be fostered through legitimate and practical means.

We, the present members of the Florida Racing Commission, express to you our deep appreciation for the trust and confidence you have exhibited toward us in our administration of racing. We pledge to protect the public and state interests and shall endeavor always to keep racing upon the high plane on which it has been conducted in the past.

The Commission feels that the present racing laws are in need of revision and we highly recommend that this be undertaken during the next session of the Legislature.

The Commission further wishes to express its sincere appreciation and thanks to the many loyal and diligent persons employed by this Commission, and though they are too numerous to list herein, we nevertheless are thankful to each and everyone of them individually, and we, the Commission have indeed enjoyed our association with each of them.


