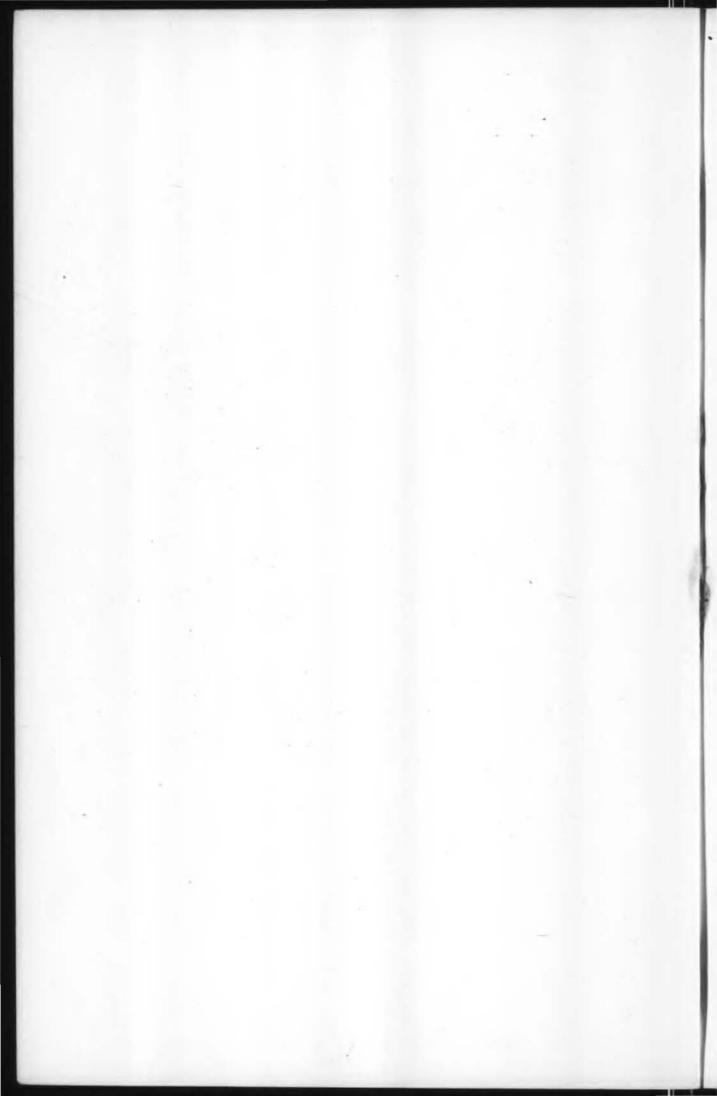

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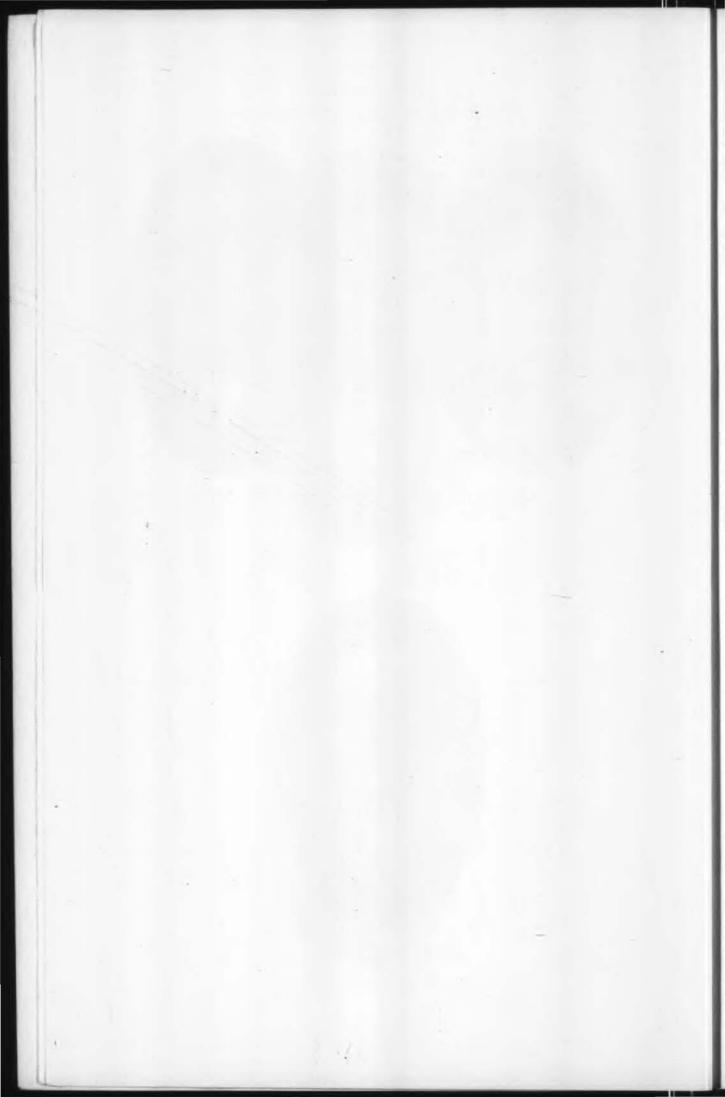

The above applications were filed during the month of June, 1959 and as of this writing the Racing Commission has not acted on them.

#### ADMINISTRATION

Robert Kelly, for many years the Supervisor of Racing and Louis Derteen, Jr., the Assistant Supervisor direct the many activities of the Racing Commission. The departments of the Commission are headed by: Irving Harrington, Sr., auditing; Tom C. Parker, investigating; and Elsie S. Bellows, Ph.D., laboratory.

The records and statistics of all the racing activities are kept under the supervision of Mr. Harrington and George D. Johnson, Jr., in the Commission office located at 911 Metropolitan Bank Building, Miami. Additional information not contained in the report will be furnished to any one on a request addressed to the Florida State Racing Commission, Post Office Box 4781, Miami, Florida.

#### INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

The first responsibility of the Investigative Division is to promote and correlate the law enforcement program of the racing industry in this State. This program is designed with the best interest of racing and the safety of the public in mind. This division has worked very closely with law enforcement agencies in the interchange of information, records and ideas which has proven a great asset to the industry.

The Investigative Division is especially concerned with the enforcement of the commonly called "85%" law which requires at least 85% of the employees at each track to be bona-fide Florida residents and that 85% of the weekly payrolls to be paid to them. This law assures Florida residents a fair proportion of the positions at the tracks.

This division is responsible for the fingerprinting and photographing of all officers, directors and associations employees and in the keeping in the Miami office a complete file of all fingerprints and photographs. During the past season 14,176 persons were issued occupational licenses. Of this number 1,330 were new employees who were fingerprinted and photographed. When these fingerprints were processed by th Federal Bureau of Investigation, only twelve felony records were revealed. This was a marked decline from the previous year.

The Investigative Department, with the splendid cooperation of the auditing department, detected a violation at one of the tracks, whereby the State had been defrauded of moneys due the Principal State School Fund. The licenses of the three employees involved were revoked by the Commission and their cases are now pending in criminal court. The State has been reimbursed for the loss of said revenue.

This department, together with the various track police departments were instrumental in the ejection of 339 bookmakers, touts and other undesirables during the 1958-59 racing season.

The Investigative Department has kept the Commission informed of the operations and general conditions at the various tracks, thus insuring that the public is being protected.

### LABORATORY

The Commission Laboratory is concerned with the microdetection of drugs in the saliva and urine taken from racing thoroughbreds and greyhounds. Through such highly sensitive tests and techniques as crystallography, paper chromatography and spectrophotometry, microquantities of illegal drugs which would alter the racing qualities of an animal can be isolated and identified. During the year, in review, a total of 9,876 Florida samples were analyzed in addition to 290 samples submitted by other states and foreign countries. Of this total only 13 samples were found to contain illegal drugs and in 11 of these cases the drugs were of a marginal nature. The remaining two cases, one greyhound and one thoroughbred, led to suspensions of the respective trainers.

This laboratory enjoys a top reputation among the racing laboratories of the world and a continuous program of research is in force which is essential for the isolation and identification of the newly marketed drugs.

#### SCOPE OF RACING

The pari-mutuel handle for the 1958-1959 racing season broke all records and we now must count this past season as being the largest in the history of Florida racing. This was the first time since racing was placed under the supervision of the State that the State's income from pari-mutuel activities exceed the \$25 million dollar mark. This was a 3.5 percent increase over the preceding season. The importance of racing revenue to the tax structure of Florida cannot be underestimated as many worthwhile projects are dependent upon this income.

The 67 counties of the State each received \$178,300 of which \$139,500.00 was apportioned under the old racing laws and \$38,800.00 came from the additional taxes on the greyhound and harness tracks enacted by the 1955 Legislature.

Although the sum of \$25,157,459.81 was collected by the Commission during the season in review, only 2.02 percent was expended in controlling, directing and supervising the operations and activities of the various licensees. The expenditures for the past year represent a saving of \$83,924.60 from the budget appropriation. This sum was returned to the 67 Counties.

During the past year several new licensees began operations. They were the Jefferson County Kennel Club, Inc., at Monticello; Ponce de Leon Trotting Association, Inc., at Bayard; and Volusia Jai-Alai, Inc., at Daytona Beach. Also during the past season two of the Associations began operation under new managements. These tracks were the Pensacola Kennel Club, Inc., which is now operating as Florida Greyhound Racing, Inc., and Volusia County Kennel Club, Inc., now operating as the Daytona Beach Kennel Club, Inc. ### ABANDONED PARI-MUTUEL TICKETS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.164, Florida Statutes, 1957, it was declared by the Legislature that all abandoned pari-mutuel tickets over two years of age should escheat to the State for deposit in the Principal State School Fund, and be used for the support and maintenance of public free schools. A total of \$240,545.15 was received by the Commission covering unclaimed 1956-1957 pari-mutuel tickets during this past racing season. Overall control procedures for the collection of these funds has been strengthened by the auditing department Exhibit "E" of this report lists in detail the amounts remitted by the individual Associations.

### SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 550.08, Florida Statutes, 1957, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate a total of twenty-three additional days of racing during the past year for the purpose of creating and providing State Scholarships to qualified applicants from the profits derived therefrom. A total of \$293,901.79 was remitted to the State Board of Control for Institutions of Higher Learning during the past racing season. Exhibit "D" of this report list the individual amounts raised for this worthy project by each participating Association.

### CHARITY DAYS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.03, Florida Statutes, 1957, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate a total of twenty-two additional days of racing during the past year wherein the profits would go to recognized charities and institutions of higher learning, not already participating in a scholarship day. A total of \$444,614.06 was raised for these organizations with the Commission supervising the distribution of this sum as follows:

#### LEGISLATION

During the 1959 session of the Legislature, the Florida Statutes were amended to include the following provisions which affect racing:

- Possession or control of any electronic device capable of transmitting any information on the grounds of a horse or dog race track, or jai-alai fronton, now constitutes a misdemeanor.
- (2) Subpoenas issued by the Commission can now be signed by any member of the Commission, the supervisor or the assistant supervisor of racing, instead of the Secretary as previously required.
- (3) The required distance from an existing racing plant to the site of a proposed new location is now 100 miles measured on a straight line from property line to property line instead of the previously stipulated "via the most practical traveled route" measurement.
- (4) Licensees may now issue tax free passes and box seats to other racing plant permit holders subject to the approval of the Commission.
- (5) The occupational tax schedule was revised to facilitate the processing of licenses in the Miami office and at the same time assure the State that no loss of revenue would occur.
- (6) Track audits must now be submitted by and certified to by a public accountant licensed to practice in Florida.
- (7) The proceeds from lost or abandoned pari-mutuel tickets now escheat to the State at the end of one year from date of issue.

- (8) The results of the last race of each day may now be transmitted without the 15 minutes delay which was previously required.
- (9) Any dog racing plant can be used on one Sunday of each year to conduct a "hound dog derby."
- (10) Where three or more dog racing plants or two or more jai alai frontons are located within a radius of 35 miles, one such dog racing plant and one such jai ali fronton may operate for a maximum of 50 days beginning July 1st and ending on the first Monday of September, and the balance of the allowed number of days within the legal winter racing season.
- (11) Any new permit for a jai alai fronton must be submitted to the voters of the County for ratification. The distance between a proposed new fronton and an existing pari-mutuel plant is now a required 50 miles measured on a straight line from property line to property line.

### LITIGATION

Since the report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958, was submitted, one case then pending, Morris Wexler v. John R. Ring, et al., as and constituting the Florida State Racing Commission, has been terminated. The Circuit Court of Leon County on August 14, 1958, entered an order granting the petition for certiorari and quashed the order of the respondent, State Racing Commission, denying a license to the applicant. The Court in the order said:

"In quashing the mentioned order, it is not to be implied that there is a duty on the part of the Commission to grant to the applicant the license he seeks. The effect is merely to set aside the order on the question and to afford the applicant an opportunity for another hearing before the Commission at which he will be afforded the right to a fair hearing consistent with constitutional requirements."

In December, 1958, petitioner, Wexler, appeared before the Florida State Racing Commission pursuant to a notice to show cause theretofore served upon his counsel, as to why an occupational license as an owner of race horses should not be denied to him because of the matters charged in the notice, which principally had to do with his activities of 30 years in furnishing wire service to bookmakers. On January 2, 1959, the Florida State Racing Commission entered its order denying the petitioner's application for an owner's license and thereafter in February, 1959, Wexler filed a petition for writ of certiorari in the Circuit Court of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit in and for Dade County to review the decision of the Florida State Racing Commission, and upon the hearing on the petition the Court found that there was substantial and competent evidence to support the findings and order of the Commission, and entered its order denying the petition for writ of certiorari.

In addition to the foregoing, the State Racing Commission was, during the year in review, a party to the following suits:

### State ex rel Heronac, Inc. v. Florida State Racing Commission

This is a petition for writ of mandamus filed in the Supreme Court of Florida. The petitioner on June 30, 1958, filed with the State Racing Commission an application for a permit to operate a fronton for the exhibitions of Jai Alai in Dade County, Florida, which application was denied on the grounds, among others, that the application was not in conformity with the rules and regulations of the Florida State Racing Commission and the Statutes of the State of Florida. On November 13, 1958, the attorney for the petitioner filed with the Supreme Court of Florida a motion for the entry of an order denying the petition for writ of mandamus. Thereupon the Court ordered that the alternative writ issued in the cause on October 1st be discharged and the cause dismissed.

### State of Florida ex rel Florida Jai Alai, Inc. v. State Racing Commission, et al

Florida Jai Alai, Inc. filed a petition for alternative write of mandamus in the Supreme Court of Florida, requesting that the respondent, State Racing Commission of Florida be directed to issue a permit to the relator which would entitle it to operate a Jai Alai fronton in Seminole County, Florida. An alternative writ of mandamus was issued in due course, and the respondent filed its answer and return to the same. On June 26, 1958, Florida Jai Alai, Inc. filed an application for a permit to operate a Jai Alai fronton in Seminole County with the State Racing Commission. The Commission at a meeting held on August 11, 1958, found that the relator, in its application for the permit, had fully met all of the requirements of Chapter 551, Florida Statutes, and the requirements of the rules and regulations of the Commission. The Commission found that the location proposed by the relator is within twenty miles of an already licensed dog racing track, but not within twenty miles of an already licensed Jai Alai fronton. The Commission was of the belief that the opinion of Supreme Court of Florida in the case of Florida State Racing Commission v. McLaughlin et al raised some doubt as to whether Sections 551.12 and 550.05, when construed together, prohibited licensing of a fronton within one hundred miles of an already licensed racing plant. The Commission thereupon denied the application of Florida Jai-Alai, Inc., on the sole ground that Section 551.12 of the Florida Statutes might be construed to preclude the Commission from licensing a Jai-Alai fronton within twenty miles of an already licensed racing plant. The Supreme Court of Florida held that a Jai-Alai fronton permit may be issued for a location within twenty miles of an already existing dog racing plant provided it is not within twenty miles of an existing Jai-Alai fronton, and stated that the Florida State Racing Commission should have granted the application of the relator and issued the permit requested, and issued a pre-emptory writ of mandamus.

### NATIONAL CO-ORDINATION

Members of the Florida State Racing Commission are members of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners, an organization made up of Commissioners from all the various States having legalized pari-mutuel activities. Through the exchange of information and ideas, the National Association is of great benefit to each member Commission. Under an agreement of reciprocity each State recognizes rulings made by any other State Racing Board.

The 1959 Convention was held in New York City with Chairman John R. Ring presiding. Mr. Ring served the organization as president for the 1958-1959 period. Commissioner Warren H. Toole, Jr., and Louis Derteen, Jr., also attended the convention. The Association of Official Racing Chemists again held their convention in conjunction with the National Association, and, their meetings were held under the leadership of Dr. Elsie S. Bellows, who served the Chemists as president for the past year.

### FLORIDA BREEDERS

Thoroughbred breeding in Florida again made much progress during the past year. At latest count, the number of breeding farms in the State has shown an increase of almost 30% over the preceding year—and now is over 100. The temperate year-round climate, plus the nourishing soil elements have induced more northern breeders to locate their breeding and training facilities in Florida.

During the past year "Florida Breds" earned a total of \$1,102,619 which brings the grand total to more than \$7 million earned by them in the relatively few years the breeding industry has been in existence. In addition, the four Florida thoroughbred tracks paid Breeding awards totaling \$18,800 compared to \$15,200 paid the preceding fiscal year. It is interesting to note that horses foaled in Florida made 4,000 starts during the past year and won an even 400 races which is an average at which the industry can look with pride.

The second running of the Florida Breeders' Futurity at Sunshine Park was a high point of the year and this event attracted 90 nominees.

The phenomenal forward strides taken by the State's breeding, training and racing groups have been aided by the support of the Florida Breeders' Association, the racing associations, the turf writers and the Racing Commission. Such cooperation was vital in the formative stages and is assured now that success has been attained.

### CONCLUSION

We, the members of the Florida State Racing Commission, again express to you our deep appreciation for the trust and confidence you have placed in us in our administration of racing affairs. We pledge to protect the public and the State's interests and shall always endeavor to keep racing on the high plane on which it has been conducted in the past.

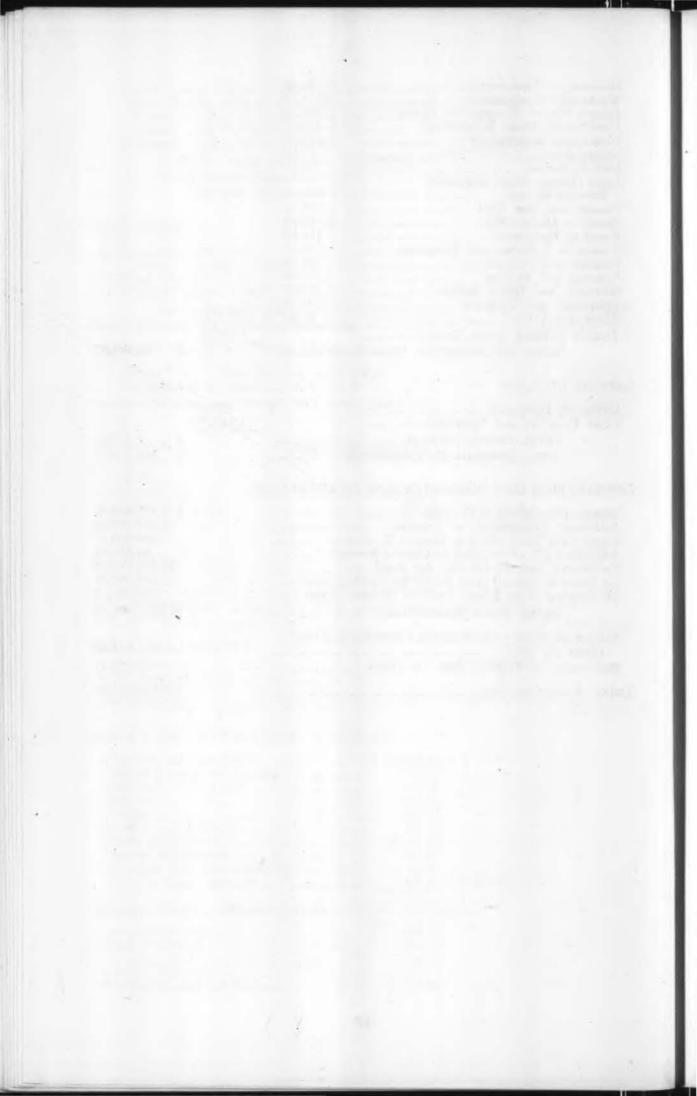

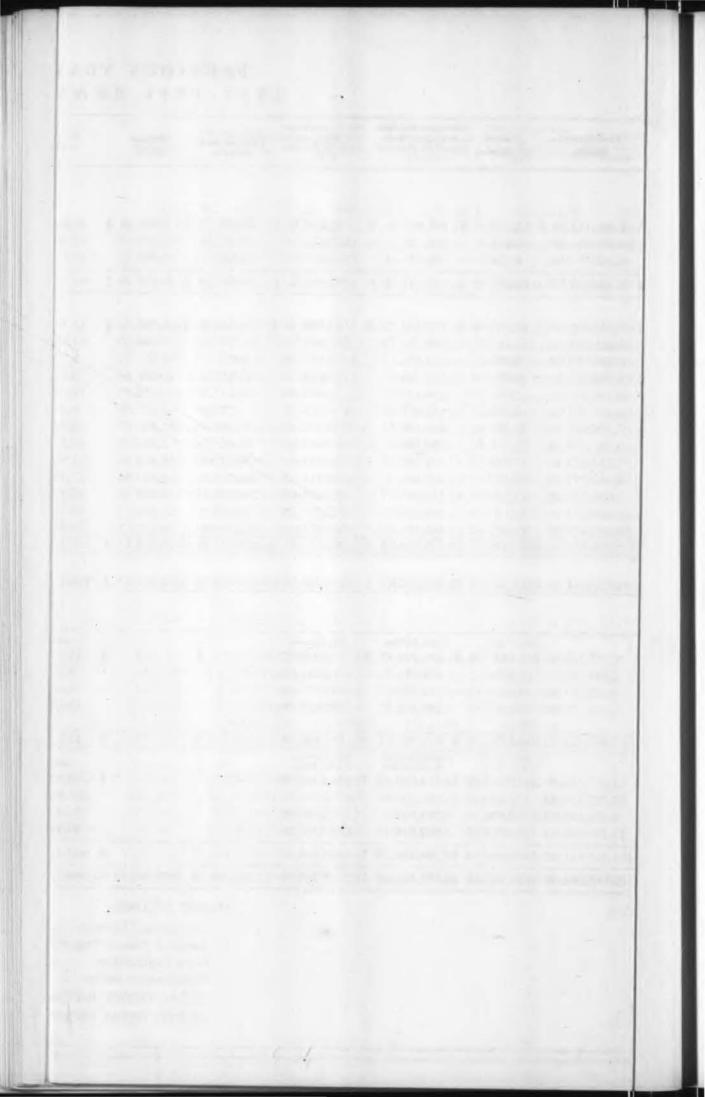
