PERMIT APPLICATION

The Florida East Coast Enterprises, Inc., filed an application for a new Jai-Alai permit in Broward County during the month of June. As of this writing, the Racing Commission had not acted upon it.

ADMINISTRATION

During the past year the Florida State Racing Commission, in order to better supervise the pari-mutuel industry of the State, employed additional personnel.

In order to assist W. Knox Eldredge, Supervisor of Racing, in the supervision of the many varied activities of the Racing Commission, the Commission employed Dr. J. G. Catlett as Assistant Supervisor of Racing to handle Horse racing and Harness racing, and L. F. Connor as Assistant Supervisor of Racing in charge of Greyhound racing and Jai-Alai Frontons.

The Investigative Division was reorganized with the employment of Frank Kappel as Chief Investigator, and Claude A. High as his assistant.

The Auditing Department is directed by George D. Johnson, Jr., Comptroller, and Elsie S. Bellows, Ph.D., supervises our fine laboratory.

The records and statistics of all racing activities in the State are kept in the Commission office located at 1350 N. W. 12th Avenue, Miami, Florida. This report contains but a small fraction of these records and any other data, too voluminous to be included in its entirety, will be gladly furnished upon request.

INVESTIGATION DIVISION

The liaison with all law enforcement agencies throughout the State, including track and fronton security forces, has been strengthened by close cooperation and exchange of information and ideas conducive to the best interest of the entire industry.

The responsibility of fingerprinting and photographing of all individuals engaged in racing operations is centered in the Investigative Division and for the past six months has been personally supervised by members of this division. During the past season, 1,307 persons were fingerprinted. Twelve (12) felony records were disclosed through a search of the fingerprints in the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. In concurrence with the Statutes of Florida, employment of the twelve (12) persons with felony records was terminated.

Two hundred and two (202) Bookmakers, Touts and other undesirables were ejected during the 1962-63 racing season by the various track and fronton security forces in cooperation with the Investigative Division. Investigations conducted by this division were many and diversified, including corrupt or unethical practices, allegations of irregularities within the industry, investigations of individuals appealing their ejection from the tracks' premises, fraud, alleged bookmaking, illegal dissemination of racing information and miscellaneous matters pertaining to the racing industry.

Periodic inspections were conducted at all racing kennels, tracks and frontons to assure that safety measures are being complied with and to assist the security forces in deterring any possible illegal activity.

The background investigations of new Owners, Trainers and other personnel, where deemed necessary, are now conducted personally by members of the Investigative Division, whereas in the past this function had been farmed out to a private agency. During the year, the entire filing system has been reworked and a Case Number, Cross Card Index System has been instituted which creates a greater amount of efficiency and expedites the handling and filing of all investigative reports. A "Mug" file (photos of known offenders relevant to the Racing Industry) was begun and will continue to grow with the securing of said photos from various sources.

All information reference to investigations conducted is recorded, submitted in written form and filed to keep the Commission apprised of all alleged illegal activities and the conditions that prevail at all tracks and frontons.

LABORATORY

The Comission's Laboratory has as its function the detection of microquantities of drugs in the saliva and urine of racing animals which might affect their performance. Such samples are taken at the tracks by licensed veterinarians who are employed by the Commission and are sent to the laboratory to be analyzed where highly sensitive tests are conducted.

During the year in review, 10,100 samples were received with a total of 16,406 analyses being performed upon them. Of all these analyses, only forty-five were identified as positive. In addition to its analytical program, the laboratory also maintains an active and continuous research program of new drug studies and conducts evaluations of new analytical methods and drug and metabolite excretion studies.

SCOPE OF RACING

The 1962-63 season was in all respects a banner year for Florida racing. Despite the Cuban Crisis in October, during which time the U. S. Army used the facilities at Gulfstream Park to quarter troops, revenues increased 3.4%, attendance was up 2.6%, and wagering increased 3.1% over the previous year.

Each of the sixty-seven counties of the State benefited by receiving a record \$206,800.00, of which \$159,200.00 was apportioned under the old racing laws and \$47,600.00 came from the additional dog taxes enacted by the 1955 Legislature. In addition, the Old Age Assistance program received in excess of thirteen and a quarter million dollars from racing. Another beneficiary of the racing revenues was our school system. Various exhibits of this report show in detail these distributions.

Although the sum of \$29,050,751.32 was collected by the Commission, only 2.19 per cent was expended in controlling, directing and supervising the operations and activities of the twenty-eight licensees. The expenditures for the past fiscal year represented a saving of \$26,233.29 from the budget appropriations and this sum has been returned for distribution to the counties.

In order to better safeguard the collection of this revenue, your Commission conducts a schooling and examining program for its track auditors. We have also published during the past year a comprehensive Procedure Manual for these employees. To the best of our knowledge, this program is unique among the many states having pari-mutuel operations.

During the past year, harness and quarter horse racing was once again conducted in Florida as the Seminole Park & Fairgrounds, Inc., commenced operations in the Orlando area.

The mutuel handle, attendance and state revenue percentage of increase or decrease for each licensee was as follows:

ABANDONED PARI-MUTUEL TICKETS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.164, Florida Statutes. it was declared by the Legislature that all abandoned pari-mutuel tickets over one year of age should escheat to the State for deposit in the Principal of the State School Fund and to be used for the support and maintenance of our public free schools. Thirteen audits of these records were conducted during the fiscal year with a total of \$265,045.70 received by the Commission. Exhibit "E" of this report lists in detail the amounts remitted by the individual Associations.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 550.08, Florida Statutes, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate additional days of racing for the expressed purpose of creating and providing State scholarships for qualified applicants from the net profits derived therefrom. These scholarships are administered by the State Board of Control for Institutions of Higher Learning. A total of \$393,641.10 was deposited to this fund during the past fiscal year. Exhibit "D" of this report lists the amounts raised by the participating licensees for this worthy project.

CHARITY DAYS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.03, Florida Statutes, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate extra days of racing, wherein the profits would go to recognized charities and institutions of higher learning not already participating in a scholarship day. Twenty-five tracks conducted such an extra day and a total of \$512,177.25 was raised for these organizations with the Commission supervising the distribution of this sum as follows:

LITIGATION

During the past year, the Florida State Racing Commission was a party to three court proceedings. On November 2, 1961, the Commission revoked the permit of Ponce de Leon Trotting Association, Inc. by reason of its financial irregularities and demonstrated inability to operate at a profit for itself and for the State and refused to grant a transfer of the permit of the Association to Broward County as authorized by Chapter 61-1940, Laws of Florida 1961. This ruling of the Commission was attacked in the Circuit Court of Leon County; and at about the same time, a companion suit was filed by West Flagler Kennel Club, Inc. and other south Florida dog tracks against the Florida State Racing Commission and others seeking a decree enjoining the transfer of the permit. The Circuit Court of Leon County entered a decree on April 19, 1962, quashing the order of the Commission revoking the permit and dismissing the complaint in the West Flagler case. Appeals from these decisions were duly prosecuted by the Commission and other affected parties to the Supreme Court of Florida. After the filing of briefs and presenting oral arguments, the Supreme Court in companion decisions on February 27, 1963, upheld the order of the Circuit Court of Leon County quashing the action of the Commission in revoking the permit of Ponce de Leon Trotting Association, Inc. but reversing the decision of the Circuit Court upholding the constitutionality of Chapter 61-1940. This act was declared to be a special act and unconstitutional as such since it related solely to the Ponce de Leon Trotting Association, Inc. permit and to the transfer of this one permit alone to a designated location in Broward County. In the opinion of the Supreme Court upholding the action of the Circuit Court in quashing the order of revocation, the Supreme Court adhered to previous decisions of the Court holding that the Commission has no power to revoke a permit unless the racing statutes or the regulations of the Commission have been violated knowingly and with a "stubborn purpose, with evil intent, without justifiable excuse." However, although the effect of the decision was to leave the permit unrevoked, no further efforts have been made to secure a license for racing dates under the permit because of the apparently inability of the permit holder to demonstrate financial responsibility.

The 1963 Legislature passed another harness bill, Chapter 63-130, Laws of Florida, 1963, purporting to effect all harness tracks and permitting any holder of a horse, dog, or harness permit meeting certain specified conditions to secure a license for the operation of a harness track in any county in which two favorable referendum elections for dog or horse racing had previously been held. Under this act, Tourist Enterprises, Inc., the holder of the Key West dog track permit made application to the Commission for a license to conduct harness racing at a specified location near Pompano, in Broward County. This application was granted by the Commission, but a companion application by the permit holder to lease the facilities of Gulf Stream Park for harness racing under the same act was denied. The act of the Commission in granting the application was attacked in a suit filed in the Circuit Court of Leon County in the latter part of June, 1963, by Biscayne Kennel Club and other dog tracks and Hialeah Race Course, Inc. based on the alleged unconstitutionality of Chapter 63-130. When a decision is rendered by the Circuit Court of Leon County, such decision in all probability will be appealed to the Supreme Court of Florida for a final determination as to the constitutionality of the act and the operation of harness racing by Tourist Enterprises in Broward County.

During the past year, the Commission took disciplinary action against a number of individuals and permit holders for various violations of the racing laws and the racing regulations of the Commission. One such disciplinary action by the Commission has resulted in an appeal to the Circuit Court of Dade County, Florida, by William J. Hartack, Jr., who was fined \$100.00 for failing to attend a hearing at the request of the stewards at Gulfstream Park. This appeal is now pending in the Circuit Court of Dade County and will be decided after the filing of briefs and argument by counsel.

LEGISLATION

The 1963 session of the Florida State Legislature which convened in April, 1963, and adjourned on June 19, 1963, after an extension of the regular session, enacted a number of changes in the racing laws of Florida. The Florida State Racing Commission sponsored and supported the passage of several acts which have now become law which strengthened and clarified the racing laws.

Chapter 63-264, Laws of Florida 1963, amended Section 550.01, Florida Statutes by providing four year staggered terms of the members of the Commission, beginning in the year 1965, and by removing the limitation on the amount of the salary of the attorney for the Commission and by providing for the maintenance of the Commission office in Miami instead of Tallahassee as had previously been provided by law. Under the terms of this act, beginning in 1965, two members of the Commission will be appointed for four year terms with the remaining three members of the Commission being appointed for four year terms in the second, third, and fourth years thereafter. The effect of this provision will be that three members of the Commission will be "held over" from one gubernatorial administration into the next administration, with the result of giving desirable continuance and stability to the administration of the racing laws in the future. Under the previous law, all of the members of the Commission were appointed by each new governor, with the result that in most cases a very considerable period of time elapsed before all members of the new Commission became fully familiar with the laws and regulations and with the intricate details of the operation of the harness, horse, and dog racing establishments and the jai-alai frontons regulated by the Commission. The main offices of the Commission and its laboratory have been located in Miami ever since racing was legalized in Florida and the designation of Miami as the main office of the Commission eliminated the necessity of maintaining an office in name only in Tallahassee. Finally, the \$3,000.00 limitation on the salary of the attorney for the Commission was obviously inadequate in the light of the present day volume of legal work and the time involved in attending the numerous meetings of the Commission.

Two very beneficial acts were passed (Chapter 63-315 and Chapter 63-444) spelling out in the racing act the allowable deductions for the cost of operation of the scholarship days and charity days which each track and fronton is permitted to hold for the benefit of scholarship and charity each year. The present Commission had finally adopted rules spelling out the allowable deductions shortly prior to the Legislative session and the two 1963 acts wrote these regulations into law. It is believed that the adoption of the new Commission regulations and the enactment of the two laws above mentioned will result in increased contributions to scholarships and charities and will largely eliminate the wide variances which previously existed in the interpretation of the laws by the tracks and frontons in former years.

Another piece of legislation which passed in the 1963 session should promote the horse racing and breeding industry in Florida. Chapter 63-314, Laws of Florida 1963, creates a Florida horse racing promotion fund by increasing the "breaks" tax at horse tracks from five cents to ten cents and placing the revenue derived from this additional tax in a promotion fund to be administered by the Commission supplementing and augmenting purses at the Florida horse race tracks. The passage of this act will enable the Florida horse tracks to compete on more even terms with the northern and western horse tracks which have been lengthening their seasons from year to year so as to more and more overlap the Florida winter horse racing season and which have been attracting horses which might otherwise have raced in Florida by reason of larger purses and stakes. It is estimated that this new promotion fund will amount to approximately one million dollars per year and it is contemplated that this fund will be divided between the various tracks in the manner best calculated to meet out-of-state competition and to continue the promotion of horse racing and horse racing revenues in Florida.

Another act which was adopted at the 1963 session was an act requiring the various horse tracks to pay breeders' awards in specified amounts to the breeder of any Florida thoroughbred winning a race at any licensed race track in Florida. Such awards have been paid by the tracks to Florida breeders for a number of years in accordance with the regulations of the Commission. The validity of these regulations have been questioned from time to time by the horse track permit holders. The passage of Chapter 63-161, Laws of Florida 1963 wrote the requirement for the payment of these breeders' awards into law, thus setting at rest any question of the legality of paying same. The passage of this act should offer a further inducement to the continuance of the growth of the thoroughbred industry in Florida.

Two other acts which passed at the 1963 session affected only the harness

racing segment of the industry. Chapter 63-261, Laws of Florida 1963, wrote into law fixed daily license fees on a sliding scale in lieu of the regular permanent tax for harness tracks in order to provide some relief to the still struggling harness tracks. Chapter 63-130, Laws of Florida 1963, made a number of changes in existing harness track laws and specifically permitted the holders of harness, horse, or dog track permits meeting certain conditions specified in the law to secure a license to operate harness racing only in any county in which two favorable referendum elections have been held for horse or dog racing tracks. Under the terms of this act, the holders of the Key West dog track permit have applied to the Commission and have been granted a license to operate harness racing near Pompano, in Broward County. The constitutionality of this act is now under attack in a suit pending in the Circuit Court of Leon County and will not finally be determined until after a probable appeal of the decision to the Supreme Court of Florida.

During the 1963 session, a number of other acts affecting racing were proposed but did not receive Legislature approval. Another effort was made in the session to change the present horse racing dates structure as provided by law for the three horse tracks in the lower east coast area of Florida. This bill was defeated in the Florida State Senate. The Commission sponsored two acts to increase the revenue to the State from the dog tracks and jai-alai frontons, but both of these acts were killed in committee in the House of Representatives. Another proposed act which died on the Senate calendar was an act which would have required the number of Florida residents in the employ of pari-mutuel establishments to be increased from eighty-five per cent to ninety per cent.

One other act taken at the 1963 session of the Florida Legislature affecting racing is deserving of particular mention. The Legislature, by a joint resolution adopted in both houses, authorized a Legislative council with the assistance of the Florida State Racing Commission to conduct a study of all phases of racing and to report its findings ad recommendations to the 1965 session of the Legislature. Florida's racing laws have not been revised since the original enactment of the racing statutes in the year 1931. The Commission now regulates four horse tracks, seventeen dog tracks, and six jai-alai frontons and one harness track, and it is believed that a study of all phases of the industry and the laws and regulations affecting same will result in recommendations for the improvement of the industry and increased revenues to the State. The Racing Commission will give full cooperation to the Legislative council in the making of this study.

FLORIDA BREEDERS

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeding industry continues to expand in 1962 — both in quality and quantity.

Florida-bred Thoroughbreds won more races throughout the nation than in any previous season. They were particularly impressive at home. A tabulation of Florida-bred wins at the state's four tracks during the 1962-63 season reflects:

In addition, many new farms were added to the imposing list of establishments in the state. Estimates indicate that Florida, on the basis of its foal production of approximately 800 during the 1963 foaling season, may become the third leading state in the nation in the production of thoroughbreds.

A number of young Florida-bred runners gave indication in early 1963 that they would join the long list of Florida stake stars. In this group were Behaving Deby, the early favorite for championship honors in her division, and Dunfee, undefeated through his victory in the Joliet Stakes at Chicago.

Of special importance to Florida racing and breeding was legislation passed at the 1963 session. Increases in breakage on pari-mutuel wagering at the state's four tracks will provide an estimated \$1,000,000 annually which will go into a special fund to be administered by the Racing Commission. This fund will increase purses at the state's tracks, help provide a realistic stake program for Florida-breds, and help the area meet competition brought on by extended racing dates in the North and East. This measure was supported in the legislature by the Racing Commission, The FTBA, and all four Thoroughbred tracks.

Another bill passed requires that breeders of Florida-bred winners at Florida tracks receive a sum equal to ten percent of the gross purse on all overnight races as breeders' awards. This law replaces a Racing Commission rule and will serve as a strong incentive to the expansion of the breeding industry.

These measures teamed with the State's Florida-bred preferred race plan, approved by the Governor and the State Legislature two years ago, enhances in great measure the overall Thoroughbred structure in the state.

CONCLUSION

We, the present members of the Florida State Racing Commission, express to you our appreciation for the trust and confidence which you have placed in us and assure you that we will always protect the public and the State's interest at all times and keep racing on the highest plane.




