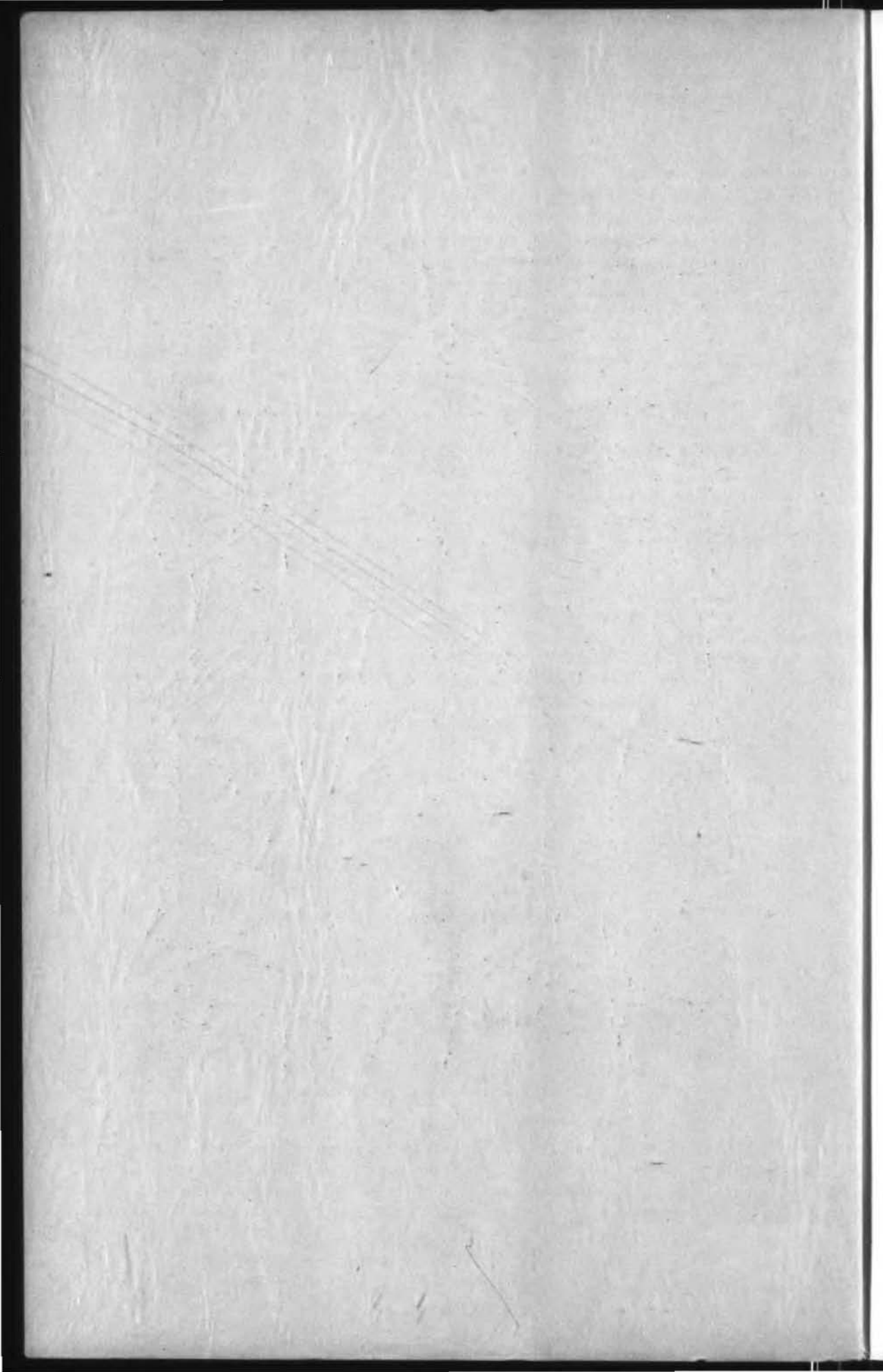

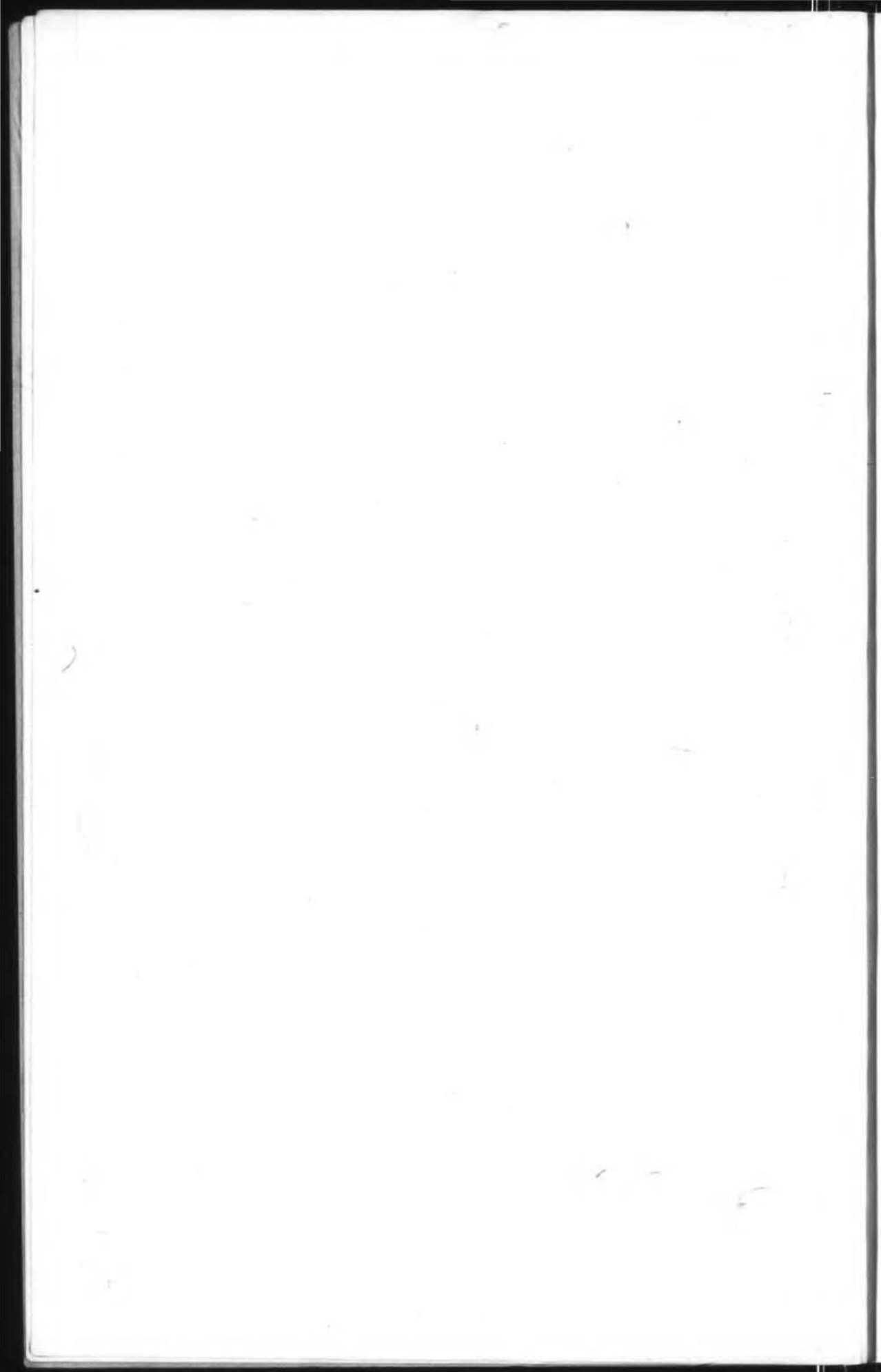

In compliance with the requirements of Chapter 550.02, subsection 2, Florida Statutes, the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering (Florida State Racing Commission) submits this, its Thirty-Ninth Annual Report for the period beginning July 1, 1969, and ending with the close of business on June 30, 1970.

During the year in review, the membership of the Racing Commission consisted of the following named persons:

During the year in review, L. B. Walker served as Chairman until October 24, at which time he was succeeded by Alfred S. Austin, who served in this office through the remainder of the fiscal year. L. D. Plante served as the Commission Secretary until his resignation, and he was succeeded in this capacity by Dr. Fred J. Ackel on June 5. The Commission was represented in its legal affairs by Judson A. Samuels of Hollywood until October and by Shelby Highsmith of Miami for the remainder of the fiscal year.

PERMIT HOLDERS

There are thirty-one valid permits to conduct pari-mutuel wagering in the varied fields of thoroughbred, harness horse, quarter horse, greyhound racing and jai-alai frontons operating under the jurisdiction of the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.

During the year in review, pari-mutuel activities were conducted by thirty of these permit holders under annual licenses issued by the Racing Commission. Seventeen permit holders operated greyhound tracks, six operated jai-alai frontons, six operated thoroughbred horse tracks and one conducted a harness meeting. Detailed statistical analyses of each of these operations are included as Exhibits to this report.

A new permit was authorized by the 1969 Legislature for the operation of summer thoroughbred racing in Dade County. The Racing Commission granted this permit to the Miami Beach Jockey Club, Inc., at its July 2, 1969 meeting. This track opened for business May 6, 1970, using leased facilities at Tropical Park. The permit held by Seminole Park & Fairgrounds, Inc., a night horse track in Casselberry which last operated in 1967, was reactivated on April 20, 1970.

The one inactive permit is issued to Bayard Raceways, Inc., which holds the right to conduct racing at the Ponce de Leon Raceway, Bayard, Florida, and which has been dormant for the past ten years. This permit holder has applied for and received operating dates for the fall of 1970.

ADMINISTRATION

George D. Johnson, Jr., Division Director, administered the many and varied activities of the Racing Commission. He was ably assisted by Dr. P. H. Dougherty, Laboratory Manager; Tom C. Parker, Chief Investigator; and Tom G. Ozmer, Jr., Administrative Assistant.

The records of all racing activities in the State are maintained and controlled at the Division Office located in the State Office Building, 1350 N. W. 12th Avenue, Room 510, Miami, Florida. Since this report contains but a small fraction of these records, any additional information will be gladly furnished upon request.

The 1969-70 fiscal year saw the end of an era and the beginning of a new one, as the 1969 Legislature reorganized the executive branch of State government. In this reorganizational structure the Racing Commission was kept

as a board, but placed into the Department of Business Regulation and made a Division thereof. The Racing Commission continues to exercise its powers, duties and functions as in the past, subject to the review and approval of the Department.

The complete review of all rules and regulations promulgated by this body begun three years ago was completed during 1970 with the revision of the jai-alai and quarter horse rule books. The continuation of training seminars for our track and fronton State employees effected a closer working relationship with our Miami office personnel, such training sessions being held at Tampa in October, at Miami in December, and the third at Tallahassee in April. All were well attended and we found them to be of great benefit.

For the past three years a feasibility study has been conducted by our accounting staff to determine the practical aspects of using electronic calculators in lieu of auditor personnel at the tracks and frontons to see if, by the use of such mechanical devices, this work could be done with more efficiency and at less cost. After reviewing this study your Commission concluded that the use of electronic calculators would save the taxpayers of the State of Florida in excess of \$100,000. annually, and directed the staff to secure twenty such machines. We are pleased to report that twelve of these calculators were in operation by the close of the fiscal year and the balance will be placed into the field with the opening of the winter operations.

INVESTIGATION BUREAU

In order to better protect the public the Racing Commission maintains an investigation bureau whose duty is to enforce the laws of Florida and the rules and regulations of racing as enacted by the Commission. This bureau works closely with the local law enforcement agencies and the associations' own security forces to effectively promote and correlate the investigation of all illegal activities at the race tracks and frontons in the State.

This Bureau also concerns itself with the enforcement of Florida Statute 550.27, commonly called the "85% law", which requires that at least this percentage of the employees at each track or fronton be bona fide Florida residents and that such a percentage of the weekly payroll be paid to them. This law assures local residents of a fair opportunity for employment at the pari-mutuel establishments.

During the past fiscal year this bureau, together with the security departments of tracks and frontons, was instrumental in the ejection of three hundred and twenty-nine undesirables from the grounds of the various associations.

Florida Statutes require that all persons employed in the industry be licensed, fingerprinted and photographed. The Investigation Bureau is responsible for the supervision of this activity and, through the use of data processing equipment, maintains a complete up-to-date record on each person. During the past season 24,488 occupational licenses were issued, an increase of 14%. Of this number 8,298 persons required new fingerprints and photographs. This increases the total to 52,523 persons whose prints are on file with this agency.

LABORATORY

The Commission Laboratory, the oldest of its kind in the United States, enjoys a top reputation among the racing laboratories of the world. Its function is the detection of micro quantities of drugs in the saliva and urine of racing animals which might affect their performance. Such samples are taken by licensed veterinarians who are employed by the Division.

During the year in review a record 25,521 samples were received, with a total of 31,549 analyses being performed on them. The cost per analysis was \$2.67. Of these samples only twenty-one (eleven greyhound, nine horse, one harness) were identified as chemically positive, and appropriate investigative action was taken.

In addition to its analytical purposes, the laboratory also maintains an active and continuous research program of new drugs. It also conducts evaluations of new analytical methods of metabolite excretion studies. As a result of these studies during the past year the Racing Commission amended its medication rule to permit the use of hemostats and steroids at thoroughbred tracks.

During the past racing season the method of collecting urine samples at the thoroughbred tracks was changed by having our personnel use the receiving barns as detention areas. A rule amendment was passed requiring each track to construct and have ready for the 1971 season, a separate detention barn for the Division's exclusive use in collecting such urine samples.

SCOPE OF RACING

The upward trend of recent years continued with State tax revenues derived from the pari-mutuel industry breaking all records, and there is every indication that such growth will continue. Revenues increased 10.97%, attendance 8.3%, and the pari-mutuel wagering increased in excess of 13%. Each of the 67 Counties of the State benefited by receiving a record \$412,000. of which \$295,000. was apportioned under the old racing laws and \$117,000. came from the additional taxes levied by the 1955 Legislature. The steady rise in the sums received by each County over the past five years is shown below:

Although the sum of \$53,217,433.77 was collected by the Racing Commission during the fiscal year, only 2.09% was expended in controlling, directing and supervising the operation of the entire industry. Further economies in our agency's operations were reflected in returning to the Counties the sum of \$62,534.35 from our budgetary appropriations for further distribution.

In addition, the General Revenue Fund received in excess of 21 million dollars from pari-mutuel operations. This money was used to support the varied functions of our State government. Other beneficiaries of pari-mutuel revenues were the State's school system and many charitable organizations. The various exhibits included in this report show these disbursements in detail.

ABANDONED PARI-MUTUEL TICKETS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.164, Florida Statutes, it was declared by the legislature that all abandoned pari-mutuel tickets over one year old should escheat to the State for deposit to the Principal of the State School Fund. These funds are used for the support and maintenance of our public schools. Eleven general audits were conducted during the fiscal year verifying the total of \$590,891.25 received by the Division from this source. Exhibit "E" of this report shows in detail the amounts remitted by the individual associations.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 550.08, Florida Statutes, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate additional days of racing for the express purpose of creating and producing State Scholarships for qualified applicants. These funds are the net proceeds derived from these extra days of racing. This Scholarship Fund is administered by the State Board of Regents for Institutions of Higher Learning. A total of \$495,387.58 was deposited to this fund during the past fiscal year. Exhibit "D" of this report shows the amounts raised by the industry.

Since their inception twenty-one years ago these extra days have raised over seven million dollars for our State supported colleges.

CHARITY DAYS

Since 1952, Florida Statutes have permitted the race tracks and frontons to operate additional days of racing, wherein the profits would go to recognized charities and institutions of higher learning not already participating in a Scholarship Day. These funds are in addition to the other racing revenues detailed in this report by various exhibits. Twenty-eight tracks and frontons participated during the year and conducted extra performances in which a record total of \$1,974,652.56 was raised for approved charitable organizations and schools.

The amounts raised for all charitable organizations since these extra performances were first authorized are as follows:

LEGISLATION

The 1970 session of the Florida State Legislature considered an extraordinary number of bills which would have affected the pari-mutuel industry. There were 51 separate bills introduced on 40 topics, with only three (3) finally being enacted:

- (1) Chapter 70-226, Laws of Florida, 1970 amended Sections 550.08, 550.081, 550.26 and 550.33. This act in substance amended Chapter 69-50, Laws of Florida, which was passed by the 1969 Legislature and which authorized the Racing Commission to issue permits and regulate quarter horse racing. This chapter clarified defects found in the 1969 Act.
- (2) Chapter 73-10, Laws of Florida, 1970 amended Section 550.37(4), Florida Statutes, to allow the harness tracks licensed under this chapter to conclude their meets on or before June 1 of each year.
- (3) Chapter 70-447, Laws of Florida, 1970 amended Chapter 551, Florida Statutes by adding Section 17. Under this act the Racing Commission may extend by 24 months the time in which the holder of a ratified permit for jai-alai may construct its fronton.

LITIGATION

During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970, the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering and the Florida Racing Commission were parties to litigation as follows:

LITIGATION CONCLUDED, INITIATED OR PENDING

1. *Hialeah Race Course, Inc. and Tropical Park, Inc., Appellants, vs Gulfstream Park Racing Association, Inc., a Florida Corporation, and Florida State Racing Commission, et al, Appellees, Supreme Court of Florida #39353.*

An exhaustive report was made of the background of this case in the 1969 Annual Report to the Governor. On December 19, 1969, the Circuit Court rendered final judgment declaring Section 550.081 (3) Florida Statutes, to be unconstitutional. Subsequently, Hialeah Race Course entered its appeal to the Supreme Court of Florida. The Florida State Racing Commission remained a nominal party. Briefs have been filed by the respective parties and this matter is set for argument before the Supreme Court during the month of December 1970.

2. *W. L. McKnight dba Webster Outdoor Advertising Company vs Florida State Racing Commission, et al, District Court of Appeals, Third District, Case #70-248.*

Subsequent to the 1969 Annual Report to the Governor, the Third District Court of Appeals dismissed the plaintiff's appeal on technical grounds. Thereafter, the plaintiff cured the defect by obtaining an appropriate order from the Circuit Court and, again, filed its notice of appeal to the Third District Court of Appeal. Briefs were submitted by the plaintiff and the Florida State Racing Commission and argument was made before the District Court. On May 20, 1970, the Third District Court of Appeal affirmed the order of the Circuit Court, dismissing the action as to the Florida State Racing Commission. Accordingly, this case has been concluded in favor of the Commission and the file has been closed.

3. *State of Florida, ex rel., Kenton Wells vs Florida State Racing Commission, et al, Circuit Court, Second Judicial Circuit, Leon County.*

On July 18, 1969, Kenton Wells, a citizen and resident of Dade County, Florida, filed a petition for Alternative Writ of Mandamus testing the constitutionality of Sections 550.40 through 550.47, Florida Statutes (South Florida summer thoroughbred racing act). The petition sought to require the Racing Commission to revoke the permit granted under the act. The Circuit Court held that the permit was invalid because no referendum was required by the Commission and issued a Peremptory Writ of Mandamus requiring the Racing Commission to revoke the permit previously granted.

The Racing Commission and the Miami Beach Jockey Club, Inc. appealed the decision to the First District Court of Appeal. After briefs and argument the District Court on October 14 reversed the decision of the Circuit Court and instructed the Circuit Court to enter an order declaring the permit in question valid.

4. *James Black vs South Florida Enterprises, Inc., et al, Defendants.*

This was an action against South Florida Enterprises and the Florida State Racing Commission for injunctive and declaratory relief. The plaintiff sought a mandatory order requiring Bonita-Fort Myers Corporation (Naples-Fort Myers Kennel Club) to allow the plaintiff to race his dogs and requiring the

Racing Commission to insure that the plaintiff not be denied racing privileges at said kennel club. Various motions were filed and without protracted litigation the plaintiff entered a voluntary dismissal on November 6, 1969.

5. *State of Florida, ex rel Investment Corporation of South Florida vs Board of Business Regulation of the State of Florida, et al, Supreme Court of Florida, Case #36090.*

In August 1969, the Racing Commission adopted the concept of 52 days of competitive racing and 52 days of non-competitive racing for the four (4) South Florida dog tracks. On September 12, 1969, the final dates for the respective tracks under this plan were approved. Pursuant to the provisions of the Reorganization Act of 1969, West Flagler and Biscayne appealed the decision of the Racing Commission to the Board of Business Regulation.

In October of 1969, the Board of Business Regulation reversed the ruling of the Racing Commission and set new dates for the respective tracks. On October 27, 1969, the Racing Commission was served with an Alternative Writ of Mandamus from the Supreme Court of Florida at the behest of Investment Corporation of South Florida.

Thereafter, briefs were filed and arguments were presented to the Supreme Court. On November 3, 1969, the Supreme Court of Florida issued its Peremptory Writ of Mandamus, setting aside the decision of the Board of Business Regulation and reinstating the decision of the Racing Commission.

6. *Alfred Mones vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, United States District Court, Southern District of Florida, #70-105 Civ. T.C.*

Pursuant to the provisions of Florida Statute Section 849.24(3) Alfred Mones was denied reinstatement as a patron by the Racing Commission on the basis that Mr. Mones was a convicted bookmaker. Thereafter, on January 22, 1970, Mr. Mones filed an action in the United States District Court in Miami seeking to have the Statute declared unconstitutional. Named as parties defendant (in addition to the Racing Commission and its members) were Gulfstream, Hialeah and Tropical Park.

After appropriate pleadings and pre-trial stipulation this matter was submitted to the District Court for decision on memorandums of law submitted by the various parties. It is anticipated that a decision will be forthcoming from the District Court in the near future.

7. *H. C. Vandervoort, Jr. vs Department of Business Regulation and the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, Circuit Court, Eleventh Judicial Circuit, Dade County, Florida, #70-3543.*

On December 5, 1969, the Racing Commission amended the Jockey Fees Rule, increasing the minimum fees payable to jockeys. On January 27, 1970, Mr. Vandervoort, individually, and as President of the Florida Division of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, filed a complaint in the Circuit Court seeking a declaration that said rule is unconstitutional. Appropriate pleadings were filed, the issues were joined, and upon stipulation of counsel the matter was submitted to the Circuit Court for decision upon the memorandums of law of counsel for the respective parties. This matter is presently pending.

8. *Miami Beach Jockey Club, Inc. vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Supreme Court of Florida, Case #39722.*

In January 1970 the Racing Commission approved Saturday matinees for West Flagler summer racing. On January 30, the Miami Beach Jockey Club appealed to the Board of Business Regulation, complaining that the Racing

Commission's decision placed greyhound racing in direct competition with afternoon thoroughbred racing in the South Florida area. The Board of Business Regulation affirmed the decision of the Racing Commission. On May 20, the Racing Commission was served with a Petition for Writ of Certiorari to the Supreme Court of Florida. West Flagler and the Board of Business Regulation were joined as respondents. Following appropriate pleadings the Supreme Court of Florida transferred this case to the Third District Court of Appeal where it is presently pending.

9. *Robert Martin vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Department of Business Regulation, Board of Business Regulation.*

Mr. Robert Martin, a jockey, applied to the Racing Commission seeking a waiver of the felony rule in order that he could be licensed. On January 23, 1970, the Racing Commission denied Mr. Martin's application. On January 30, Mr. Martin filed his Notice of Appeal to the Board of Business Regulation. As of June 30, this matter was pending before the Board.

10. *Daniel E. Taylor vs Department of Business Regulation and Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, Circuit Court, Eleventh Judicial Circuit, Dade County, Florida, #70-3096.*

Daniel E. Taylor, licensed horse owner, was the owner of a horse, "Doug Oswald", which was disqualified by the Stewards at Tropical Park, after having been found to have run with medication in its system. The decision of the Stewards, pursuant to the regulation of the Commission, redistributed the purse. Mr. Taylor appealed the Stewards' decision to the Racing Commission. The Commission affirmed the Stewards' decision and Mr. Taylor, thereafter on February 20, 1970, filed suit in the Circuit Court seeking a declaration of unconstitutionality of the rule requiring purse redistribution in such cases. This case is presently pending.

11. *State of Florida, ex rel., Tropical Park, Inc. vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Circuit Court, Eleventh Judicial Circuit, Dade County, Florida.*

On April 6, 1970, Richard E. Gerstein (State Attorney of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit) filed a complaint with the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering pursuant to the provisions of Section 104.27 (10), Florida Statutes, citing election law violations on the part of Hialeah, Tropical Park and Gulfstream Park Race Tracks.

The Racing Commission met on April 13, 1970, in special session to conduct an investigation of the allegations contained in Mr. Gerstein's complaint. At the outset of the meeting the Division and Commissioners were served with a Rule NISI In Prohibition enjoining the Division and the Commissioners from proceeding further with the investigation. Thereafter, on April 28, 1970, Mr. Gerstein filed with the Commission his Notice of Withdrawal of Complaint.

12. *William Katz vs Florida State Racing Commission, Circuit Court, 11th Judicial Circuit of Florida, Case #70-9828.*

William Katz, greyhound owner-trainer, was cited before the Racing Commission on June 5, 1970 for a rules violation. Prior to the hearing Mr. Katz filed a complaint in the Circuit Court seeking a temporary injunction against the Racing Commission and a declaratory judgment of the unconstitutionality of the rule involved. By appropriate pleadings the issues were joined and this matter is presently pending disposition by the Circuit Court.

13. *Biscayne Kennel Club, Inc. vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Department of Business Regulation, Board of Business Regulation, #70-9R and 70-15R.*

On May 15, 1970, the Racing Commission approved and set dates for the 1970-1971 greyhound racing season for the four South Florida dog racing tracks. The Commission again adopted the concept of 52 days of competitive racing and 52 days of non-competitive racing. On June 10, 1970, Biscayne Kennel Club filed its appeal before the Board of Business Regulation. Thereafter, on June 15, 1970, West Flagler filed its joinder in Biscayne's appeal. As of June 30, this matter was pending before the Board of Business Regulation.

14. *Harry Albert Brown vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Department of Business Regulation, Board of Business Regulation, #70-13R.*

Mr. Brown, dog-trainer, was found guilty of a rule violation by the judges at Miami Beach Kennel Club. Mr. Brown appealed the judges' decision to the Racing Commission and in conjunction therewith obtained a Stay Order from the Circuit Court, Dade County, Florida. The Racing Commission affirmed the judges' decision and on June 10, 1970, Mr. Brown served his Notice of Appeal to the Board of Business Regulation. As of June 30, this matter was pending before the Board.

15. *Frederick William Lippi vs Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al, Department of Business Regulation, Board of Business Regulation.*

Mr. Lippi applied to the Racing Commission seeking a waiver of the felony rule in order that he could be licensed as a horse owner. The Commission denied Mr. Lippi's application. On June 11, 1970, Mr. Lippi filed his Notice of Appeal with the Board of Business Regulation seeking a reversal of the Commission's denial of his application. As of June 30, this matter was pending before the Board.

In addition to the foregoing, the Commission, during the past fiscal year, sat in quasi-judicial session on nine (9) occasions and considered 153 individual cases.

NATIONAL COORDINATION

Members of the Florida State Racing Commission are members of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners, an organization made up of Commissioners from all of the various States having legalized pari-mutuel activities. Through the exchange of information and ideas, the National Association is of great benefit to each member of the Association. Under a reciprocity agreement, each state recognizes rulings made by any other state racing board.

The 1970 Convention was held in Miami during March, with Florida being the host state. We were honored by the election of L. B. Walker to the office of First Vice President of this organization. Those attending in addition to Mr. Walker were Chairman Alfred S. Austin; L. D. Plante, Commission Secretary; and George D. Johnson, Jr., Director.

The Association of Official Racing Chemists also held their convention in Miami, in conjunction with the National Association of State Racing Commissioners. Florida was represented by its Laboratory Manager, Dr. P. H. Dougherty, who was elevated to Fellowship status during the convention.

FLORIDA BREEDING

This fiscal year has seen a continued expansion of the thoroughbred breeding industry in Florida and more laurels for Florida-bred runners in the

major stakes competition throughout the country. It was but a short twenty years ago that the first Florida-bred horse won a stakes race in major competition in New York. In comparison, for the first four months of the New York 1970 season, out of 45 stakes contested for, twelve of them were won by Florida-breds. This is the finest evidence to show the impact that the Florida breeding industry has had on the national scene. Further evidence that Florida is definitely established as one of the Nation's top market places for thoroughbreds is the report of the Florida Breeders' Sales Company that their auctions conducted during the months of October in Ocala and February at Hialeah grossed over seven million dollars. This continued increase established anew the value of the breeding industry to our State's economic picture.

CONCLUSION

We, the members of the Florida State Racing Commission, express to you our appreciation for the trust and confidence which you have placed in us. We assure you that we will always protect the interest of the public, members of the various phases of the racing industry, and the State of Florida, by seeing to it that racing is conducted in only the highest possible manner.
