



Dear Governor Askew:

The Florida Pari-Mutuel Commission and the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering submits the Forty-Seventh Annual Report for the period beginning July 1, 1977 and ending June 30, 1978, in compliance with the requirements of Chapters 20.16(4)(d) and 550.02(2), Florida Statutes.

The most significant legislative development during the fiscal year was the approval by the Governor of legislation abolishing the Board of Business Regulation and creating the Florida Pari-Mutuel Commission. Since 1971, the Department of Business Regulation, of which Pari-Mutuel Wagering is one of five Divisions, has been governed by a Board appointed by the Governor. The new legislation established the position of Secretary for the Department and J. Jackson Walter was appointed by the Governor to serve in the position. The new Pari-Mutuel Commission was given the authority and responsibility for awarding racing dates; hearing appeals of all decisions which relate to the suspension or revocation of a parimutuel wagering license; making recommendations to the Division regarding new or existing rules for all racing and jai-alai operations; and issuing an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature on the racing and jai-alai industry in Florida. The Governor appointed Walter S. McLin III, an attorney from Leesburg, to chair the Commission and named Mildred Ravenell, Leon VanWert, Jack Betz and Billy Vessels as members.

This Annual Report presents an accurate record of the activities of the Division and the pari-mutuel industry during the fiscal year. The records, files and documents from which the Report is compiled are maintained at the Division office in the State Office Building, 1350 N. W. 12th Avenue, Room 510, Miami, Florida 33136. These records are open for inspection to all persons during regular business hours.

INVESTIGATION SECTION

The Division has expanded the staff and activities of the Investigative Section and has continued its cooperation with Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies. A primary objective of the Investigative Unit is to insure that only those persons meeting the requirements of law participate in pari-mutuel activities.

The staff investigators are involved in background reviews of applicants for licenses; enforcement of the Division's rules regulating the use of drugs and medications on racing animals; determining whether or not the rules of racing and jai-alai have been violated and preparing all cases for formal hearings before the Division; and investigating complaints made by the public of improper pari-mutuel activities.

During the fiscal year, the investigative staff has expanded efforts to determine the ownership and management of all 350 concessionaires licensed to provide services at the tracks and frontons.

LICENSE SECTION

All persons employed in any capacity at the tracks and frontons must be fingerprinted, photographed and licensed. The Licensing Section uses data processing equipment to maintain a complete record of each person licensed. During the fiscal year, 35,028 occupational licenses were issued. A record is also maintained of all persons declared ineligible for licensing in other racing jurisdictions.

The Licensing Section insures a compliance with Chapter 550.27, Florida Statutes, commonly called the "85% Law." This law requires that a percentage of the employees at each track or fronton be residents of Florida.

LABORATORY

During the fiscal year a major priority has been the improvement of the State Racing Laboratory. The primary function of the Laboratory is the detection of micro-quantities of drugs in the blood or urine of racing animals which might affect their performance. Because Florida is a leading racing state and the number of tracks has increased during the past several years, the Division doubled the size of the professional staff of the Laboratory and greatly increased the equipment and supplies necessary for a modern scientific facility.

During the fiscal year, 38,754 samples were received in the Laboratory and 85,276 routine analyses were performed. In addition, 13,312 special analyses were performed on various horse and greyhound samples. The cost per sample analysis was \$2.69.

As a result of the expansion of the Laboratory, 207 positive samples were found to contain prohibited drugs or medications, and appropriate disciplinary action was taken. The number of positives compares with only 16 reported the previous year.

PERMIT HOLDERS

Thirty-seven permits to conduct pari-mutuel wagering have been granted by the Division. During the fiscal year, pari-mutuel activities were conducted at eighteen greyhound tracks, ten jai-alai frontons, five thoroughbred tracks, two harness tracks and one quarter horse track. Detailed statistical analyses of each of these tracks and frontons are included in the exhibits of this Report.

SCOPE OF PARI-MUTUELS

A modest increase occurred in all pari-mutuel categories during the past fiscal year. State pari-mutuel tax revenue increased 3%, attendance increased to 3%, and gross pari-mutuel wagering increased 9%.

Florida had a record number of 4,590 pari-mutuel performances during the past

fiscal year.

The sum of \$91,211,859 was collected from all sources by the Division during the fiscal year. Of this amount \$1,990,140 was expended in controlling, directing, and supervising the operation of the entire industry.

The sum of \$29,915,500 was distributed to the 67 counties, each receiving \$446,500. This is the maximum amount permitted because of a ceiling placed on

such distribution by the 1971 Legislature.

An additional amount of \$9,371,856, which under the former statute would have been distributed to the counties, was deposited in the State General Revenue Fund.

In addition, \$46,864,502 was deposited in the State General Revenue Fund to support the varied functions of our state government.

Other monies were distributed to the Racing Promotional Trust Fund, Racing Scholarship Trust Fund, State School Trust Fund and the Bicentennial Trust Fund, as enumerated in Schedule "G," Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements.

A recapitulation of the pari-mutuel handle, attendance, and tax revenue amounts, along with the percentages of increase and/or decrease for each licensee, is found on page 15.

CHARITY DAYS

Thirty-one tracks and frontons operated a total of 113 extra performances during the fiscal year for approved charitable organizations and schools.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 550.08, Florida Statutes, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate additional days for the express purpose of creating and producing state scholarships for qualified applicants. These funds are the net proceeds derived from the extra days. This scholarship fund is administered by the State Board of Regents for institutions of higher learning. A total of \$543,991.40 was deposited to this fund in the past fiscal year. Exhibit "H" of this report shows the amounts raised by the industry.

Since their inception twenty-eight years ago, these extra days have raised

\$13,159,270.63 for our state-supported colleges.

ABANDONED PARI-MUTUEL TICKETS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.164, Florida Statutes, it was declared by the Legislature that all abandoned pari-mutuel tickets over one year old should escheat to the state for deposit to the Principal of the State School Fund. These funds are used for the support and maintenance of our public schools. A total of \$1,582,011.10 was received from this source by the Division throughout the fiscal year, and related audits were made. Exhibit "I" of this report shows in detail the amounts remitted by the individual associations.

Yearly receipts dating from 1957, when the Division first began collecting these funds, are itemized below:

LEGISLATION

The following bills were passed that relate to racing and pari-mutuel wagering:

1. Chapter 78-36; an act relating to bookmaking; amending Section 849.25, Florida Statutes; re-defining bookmaking; providing penalties; creating Section 550.361 Florida Statutes; prohibiting bookmaking at pari-mutuel track/fronton; denying attendance to tracks/frontons of known bookmakers; specifying duties of track employees with regard to bookmaking; requiring the display of warning against bookmaking; repealing Section 849.24, Florida Statutes, relating to bookmaking; providing effective date.

2. Chapter 78-39; an act relating to horseracing; amending Section 550.38(1) Florida Statutes; requiring the permanent standing of a stallion in Florida to be eligible for stallion awards; providing for death of stallion; providing that Section 550.38, Florida Statutes, as amended by Chapter 77-167, Laws of Florida, relating to breeders' awards for Florida bred horses, shall not expire on July 1, 1979.

3. Chapter 78-51; an act relating to business regulation; requiring applications for licenses or renewals of licenses issued by the Department of Business Regulation, to contain a current list of owners and managers; providing grounds for revocation, suspension, and denial of licensess requiring applications to be made under oath; providing an effective date.

4. Chapter 78-92; an act relating to computer crimes; creating Section 815, Florida Statutes; providing a short title; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; providing for offenses against intellectual property; providing for offenses against computer equipment and supplies; providing for offenses against computer users; providing penalties; providing that provisions of this chapter are not exclusive; providing effective date.

5. Chapter 78-130; an act relating to horseracing; amending Chapter 78-39 Laws of Florida; providing that the provisions of Section 550.42, Florida Statutes, as created by Chapter 77-167, Laws of Florida, shall not expire on July 1, 1979; providing that breeders' awards be paid from the breaks tax and the balance be deposited in the General Revenue Fund.

- 6. Chapter 78-131; an act relating to governmental reorganization; amending Section 20.16(1)-(4), Florida Statutes, 1977, reorganizing the Department of Business Regulation and creating the position of Secretary of Business Regulation as the head of the department; providing for the appointment of the Secretary; establishing divisions of the department; providing for the appointment of Division Directors; creating a Florida Pari-Mutuel Commission within the department.
- 7. Chapter 78-167; an act relating to thoroughbred horseracing; creating Section 550.2615, Florida Statutes, providing for the distribution of certain funds deducted from the purse pool to a horsemen's association; providing for an audit of all such accounts by the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.
- 8. Chapter 78-229; an act relating to Solicitation of Charitable Funds; amending Sections 496.02, 496.021, 496.03, 496.04, 496.031, 496.09, Florida Statutes.
- 9. Chapter 78-243; an act relative to pari-mutuel wagering; creating Section 550.48, Florida Statutes; providing for the licensing of pari-mutuel totalisators' owners and operators, and employees thereof; providing definitions; prescribing annual license fees; providing for audits and investigations of licensee; providing for issuance of summonses, subpoenas, and subpoenas duces tecum; providing for adoption of rules; providing circumstances for suspension or revocation of license or imposition of civil penalties.
- 10. Chapter 78-319; an act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; creating Section 550.0831, Florida Statutes; providing that a pari-mutuel permitholder conducting dog racing in 1977 and thereafter in a county having only one such racetrack may conduct dog meets or meetings upon the days and dates of such permitholder's choice excluding Sundays, not to exceed the total of 105 racing days in each racing year, plus charity and scholarship days; adding Section 550.03(2) (k), Florida Statutes; providing for a day of charity operation for the Daytona Beach Jai Alai Fronton of Volusia County.
- 11. Chapter 78-337; an act relating to horseracing; amending Section 550.26(5), Florida Statutes; providing that payments from the Florida Harness Horse Racing Promotion Fund may be made directly to the Florida Standardbred Breeder's and Owner's Association.
- 12. Chapter 78-357; an act relating to historic preservation; adding paragraph (k) to Section 550.03(2), Florida Statutes, authorizing licensed racetracks and frontons to conduct additional charity days under certain circumstances; proceeds to Historic Preservation Trust Fund.
- Chapter 78-380; an act relating to Jai-Alai frontons; amending Section 551.12, Florida Statutes; modifying restrictions relating to days and hours of operation.
- 14. Chapter 78-381; an act relating to charity days; adding paragraph (k) to Section 550.03(2), Florida Statutes, authorizing an additional charity day for all Jai-Alai frontons in Broward County; providing for payment of such funds to the Broward Community College Foundation, Inc.
- 15. Chapter 78-391; an act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; creating Section 550.215, Florida Statutes, authorizing the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering to assess certain charges relating to determining the eligibility of an applicant for a transfer of a pari-mutuel permit.

LITIGATION

During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978, the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering was a party to approximately six law suits arising out of regulation by the Division. These actions can generally be characterized as appeals from individual license suspensions or revocations and litigation concerning the constitutionality of various sections of the pari-mutuel statutes and rules. The number of

cases in litigation shows a marked decrease over previous years.

In Volusia Jai-Alai v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, (Dade County, Case No. 78-10636) Florida subsidiaries of the now-dissolved Emprise Corporation of Buffalo, New York, and its successor Sportsystems, Inc., sued the Division in a declaratory judgment action seeking to have Section 550.181, Florida Statutes, known as the Pari-Mutuel Felony Statute, declared unconstitutional. The Pari-Mutuel Felony Statute, which became effective on July 1, 1978, prohibits any entity convicted of a felony from holding 10% or more interest in a pari-mutuel permit. Emprise Corporation, now known as Sportsystems, Inc., was convicted of a felony in 1972. Emprise/Sportsystems has two wholly owned subsidiaries in Florida holding pari-mutuel permits. The suit was filed in anticipation of Division action to force Emprise/Sportsystems to divest its interest in these permits because of the corporate felony conviction. The case is significant because it is the first litigation concerning the new Pari-Mutuel Felony Statute.

In W. F. Caple v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, (Case No. 52,865, Supreme Court of Florida) a licensed trainer had been suspended for sixty (60) days because of violations of the Division's rules relating to drugs and medications. On appeal, the trainer successfully contended that the rules in question were absolute insurer rules and violated due process of law. The Division asked the Third District Court of Appeals to certify the question of strict liability of drug and medication rules for trainers as one of great public importance. The Florida Supreme Court accepted jurisdiction and a decision is expected in the near future. The case is significant due to the virtual impossibility of controlling illegal drugs and medications on a race track unless strict liability without fault can be imposed on a trainer for the condition of his horse and his barn premises. Without strict liability, the Division would have to show knowledge or negligence by a trainer every time a violation occurred. If this were necessary, the effective enforcement of drug and medication rules on pari-mutuel facilities would be non-existent. If illegal drugs and medication are not controlled to the satisfaction of the wagering public, the integrity of the entire industry is jeopardized.

In Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, et al., v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, et al., (Dade Circuit Court) a horsemen's association is challenging the constitutionality of Section 550.2615, Florida Statutes, which directs that one per cent (1%) of the portion of thoroughbred purses mandated by law for winning entries be deducted and paid for the benefit of the horsemen's association which represents a majority of the owners and trainers of thoroughbred horses stabled in Florida for a continuous twelve-month period. Although state revenue is not involved, the statute requires the Division to audit the distribution of funds collected under the act to the Horsemen's Association and to promulgate

rules.

In Tourist Attractions, Inc. v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, (Dade Circuit Court) Pompano Park, a licensed harness track, successfully contended in the lower court that it was due an additional allowance under the provisions of certain

harness racing relief provisions passed in 1975, more specifically Section 550.489, Florida Statutes. The Division contended that the claimed relief violated the plain and unambiguous provisions of the statute and that Pompano Park, Tourist Attractions, Inc., was indebted to the State for an additional amount. The Division is appealing this decision. No long term consequence of the litigation is foreseen, since the statute under which the action arose automatically expired in June, 1977.

NATIONAL COORDINATION

The Division is an active member of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners (NASRC), an organization representing all states which have authorized pari-mutuel activities. Membership in the organization makes it possible to coordinate records from all racing jurisdictions and to exchange information and ideas necessary for effective regulations. Under a reciprocity agreement between all member states, each racing authority recognizes decisions and rulings made by other states.

The 1978 convention was held in Florida and was attended by representatives of the Board, the Department and the Division. The Chairman of the Pari-Mutuel Commission and the Division Director were appointed to serve on several important committees of the Association.

Florida continues to be a subscriber of the National Association of State Racing Information System (NASRIS). This system permits the Division to have instant access to a computer located in Lexington, Kentucky which contains a complete record of all decisions and rulings issued by all racing states. This invaluable system gives the Division the capability of precluding ineligible persons from participating in pari-mutuel activities in Florida.

CONCLUSION

The Commission and the Division staff appreciates the support and cooperation which has been received from members of the Legislature and their staffs. We are especially indebted to Secretary J. Jackson Walter and his entire staff for providing the leadership and assistance necessary for effective regulation of the pari-mutuel industry.


