

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

Dear Governor Graham:

The Florida Pari-Mutuel Commission and the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering submit the Forty-Eighth Annual Report for the period beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, in compliance with the requirements of Chapters 20.16(4)(d) and 550.02(2), Florida Statutes.

During this period the Florida Pari-Mutuel Commission was chaired by Walter S. McLin III, an attorney from Leesburg, and Mildred Ravenell, Leon vanWert, Jack Betz, and Billy Vessels served as members. The Pari-Mutuel Commission has the legislative authority and responsibility for awarding racing dates; hearing appeals of all decisions which relate to the suspension or revocation of a pari-mutuel wagering license; making recommendations to the Division regarding new or existing rules for all racing and jai-alai operations; and issuing an annual report to the Governor and Legislature on the racing and jai-alai industry in Florida. The most significant accomplishments of this body during the fiscal year were the commissioning of a study by Price-Waterhouse & Co. for improving controls surrounding the pari-mutuel wagering system and assisting in the revision of the pari-mutuel rules and regulations.

The Annual Report presents an accurate record of the activities of the Division and the pari-mutuel industry during the fiscal year. The records, files and documents from which the Report is compiled are maintained at the Division office in the State Office Building, 1350 N. W. 12th Avenue, Room 510, Miami, Florida 33136. These records are open for inspection to all persons during regular business hours.

## INVESTIGATION SECTION

The Division has continued to expand the staff and activities of the Investigation Section. During the year, major investigations of alleged corrupt activities within the pari-mutuel industries were conducted and several are still in progress. Assistance has been given and received from all sectors of the law enforcement community.

In an effort to meet the primary objective of the Investigative Unit, which is to insure the enforcement of the rules of racing and jai-alai, Division investigators doubled their inspections of pari-mutuel facilities. Staff investigators opened 359 cases in their investigation of license applicants, illegal drugs and medications; patron complaints; and ownership and management of concessionaires. The total effort of the Investigative Unit is geared towards insuring that only those persons meeting the appropriate legal requirements participate in pari-mutuel activities.

## LICENSE SECTION

All persons employed in any capacity at the tracks and frontons must be finger-printed, photographed and licensed. The Licensing Section uses data processing equipment to maintain a complete record of each person licensed. During the fiscal year, 35,174 occupational licenses were issued. A record is also maintained of all persons declared ineligible for licensing in other racing jurisdictions.

The Licensing Section insures a compliance with Chapter 550.27, Florida Statutes, commonly called the "85% Law." This law requires that a percentage of the employees at each track or fronton be residents of Florida.

## LABORATORY

The primary function of the Division's Racing and Research Laboratory is the detection and identification of micro-quantities of drugs which might affect the performance of Florida's racing greyhounds and horses. To fulfill this function the Laboratory must maintain an on-going research and development program on new and problem drugs. Fifty drug administration samples were studied this year, both in-house and in conjunction with other racing laboratories. The Laboratory is affiliated with the Inter-Laboratory Drug Research and Evaluation Program and the Association of Official Racing Chemists.

During the year, the Laboratory received 36,569 official urine and blood samples for analyses, which consisted of 23,099 greyhound samples and 13,470 horse samples. These samples were subjected to 81,006 analyses which resulted in 44 positive drug reports of which 34 were due to the presence of the metabolites of the narcotic fentanyl (sublimaze). All such drug positive reports are submitted to the Division Director for appropriate disciplinary action. The research and development time for the fentanyl analyses was about three years and was the result of close cooperation with the Illinois and New York State Racing Laboratories.

## PERMIT HOLDERS

Thirty-seven permits to conduct pari-mutuel wagering have been granted by the Division. During the fiscal year, pari-mutuel activities were conducted at eighteen greyhound tracks, ten jai-alai frontons, five thoroughbred tracks, two harness tracks and one quarter horse track. Detailed statistical analyses of each of these tracks and frontons are included in the exhibits of this Report.

## SCOPE OF PARI-MUTUELS

The pari-mutuel handle for the 1978-79 racing season was up 13.6% breaking all previous records, and for the first time in the history of Florida racing the State's income from pari-mutuel activities exceeded the \$100 million mark. This represents a 14% increase over the preceding season. Attendance was up 2.9%. The importance of racing revenue to the tax structure of Florida cannot be underestimated, as many worthwhile State and local projects are dependent upon this source of income.

Florida had a record number of 4,818 pari-mutuel performances during the past fiscal year.

The sum of \$103,829,406.55 was collected from all sources by the Division during the fiscal year. Of this amount \$2,466,322 was expended in regulating the operation of the entire industry.

The sum of \$29,915,500 was distributed to the 67 counties, each receiving \$446,500. This is the maximum amount permitted because of a ceiling placed on such distribution by the 1971 Legislature.

An additional amount of \$15,107,805 which under the former statute would have been distributed to the counties, was deposited in the State General Revenue Fund.

In addition, \$52,631,617 was deposited in the State General Revenue Fund to support the varied functions of our state government.

Other monies were distributed to the Racing Promotional Trust Fund, Racing Scholarship Trust Fund, and the State School Trust Fund, as enumerated in Schedule "G," Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements.

A recapitulation of the pari-mutuel handle, attendance, and tax revenue amounts, along with the percentages of increase and/or decrease for each licensee, is found on page 15.

## CHARITY DAYS

Thirty-two tracks and frontons operated a total of 125 extra performances during the fiscal year for approved charitable organizations and schools.

## SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Pursuant to Chapter 550.08, Florida Statutes, the Legislature authorized the various tracks and frontons to operate additional days for the express purpose of creating and producing state scholarships for qualified applicants. These funds are the net proceeds derived from the extra days. This scholarship fund is administered by the State Board of Regents for institutions of higher learning. A total of \$560,099.05 was deposited to this fund in the past fiscal year. Exhibit "H" of this report shows the amounts raised by the industry.

Since their inception twenty-nine years ago, these extra days have raised \$13,719,369.68 for our state-supported colleges.

## ABANDONED PARI-MUTUEL TICKETS

Pursuant to Chapter 550.164, Florida Statutes, it was declared by the Legislature that all abandoned pari-mutuel tickets over one year old should escheat to the state for deposit to the Principal of the State School Fund. These funds are used for the support and maintenance of our public schools. A total of \$2,011,455.70 was received from this source by the Division throughout the fiscal year, and related audits were made. Exhibit "I" of this report shows in detail the amounts remitted by the individual associations.

Yearly receipts dating from 1957, when the Division first began collecting these funds, are itemized below:

## LEGISLATION

The following bills were passed that relate to racing and pari-mutuel wagering:

1. Chapter 79-300; an act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; creating §550.001, Florida Statutes; extending the period of time during which the temporary provisions of §§550.081, 550.09(1), 550.091, 550.12(2)(c), 550.161(1), 550.261, 550.262(3), 550.37(5), 550.42(1), (2), (4)-(6), 550.49, 550.4901, 550.4902, 550.4903, 550.4904, 550.4905, 550.4906, 550.4907, 550.4908, and 551.071, Florida Statutes, relating to dogracing, horseracing, and jai alai, shall remain in effect until July 1, 1980; providing a retroactive effective date.

2. Chapter 79-4; an act relating to the Florida Statutes; amending §§550.011, 550.025, 550.08(1), 550.082(1), 550.083(1), 550.084, 550.181(3), 550.29, 550.291(1), 550.32, 550.37(4), (13), 550.39(1), 550.41(1), (4)-(8), 550.43, 550.45, 551.031, and 551.15(1), Florida Statutes, and §§550.03, 550.055(2), 550.07, 550.33(2)(a), and 551.12, Florida Statutes (1978 Supplement), to conform to the reorganization of the Department of Business Regulation by ch. 78-131, Laws of Florida.

## LITIGATION

The fiscal year ending June 30, 1979 saw a landmark Florida Supreme Court decision in the law governing the illegal drugging of racehorses. The decision led to the successful enforcement of the Division's drug and medication rules through the resolution of a number of administrative cases brought by the Division and involved the Division in a series of court challenges to its authority to enforce effectively the drug and medication rules.

In *Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering v. Caple*, 362 So.2d 1350 (Fla. 1978) the Florida Supreme Court on September 21, 1978, overruled thirty years of Florida precedent to uphold the Division's right to make horse trainers, by rule, responsible for protecting their horses from illegal drugging without regard to the

trainers' guilt or negligence. The Division's rules of strict liability imposed on trainers for the illegal drugging of their horses, commonly denominated "absolute insurer's rules," are necessary for the effective enforcement of the Division's drug and medications rules. These rules are essential to the confidence of the wagering public and the integrity of the pari-mutuel wagering industry. The *Caple* decision is a legal victory for the Division that will maintain the trust of the wagering public, confer immeasurable benefits on the health of the industry and ensure the humane treatment of race animals.

The *Caple* decision was scarcely three months old when the Division's laboratory issued its first reports of detecting the presence in horses of the powerful narcotic "Sublimaze." Before the fiscal year was out the laboratory was to call 34 Sublimaze positives in horses. William Snow Frates, a prominent Miami lawyer, was appointed Special Counsel to the Division to represent it in the administrative revocation proceedings brought against the occupational licenses of the trainers involved and of a veterinarian suspected of illegal participation in drugging a number of the horses. All of the cases resulted in suspensions of occupational licenses for periods ranging up to four years and in the case of the veterinarian, who did not apply for an occupational license for the 1979-80 licensing year, a declaration, after a contested proceeding, of license ineligibility for life. Of the cases brought against trainers based on the 34 positives only two are presently on appeal: *Solimena v. State*, Third District Court of Appeal, Case No. 79-2047; and *Joyce v. State*, Third District Court of Appeal, Case No. 79-1897. With one exception of an incomplete proceeding due to the inability of a trainer to participate in a hearing for poor health, the remainder of the cases have been concluded in the Division's favor.

Several lawsuits to prevent the Division from conducting these administrative proceedings were initiated in the Circuit Court for Dade County prior to the end of the fiscal year. All of the court challenges to the Division's authority to enforce its drug and medication rules have been dismissed. Special Counsel William Frates represented the Division in the court actions, as well.

Two lawsuits initiated in the previous fiscal year against the Division remained unresolved. At the end of this fiscal year neither *Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, et al., v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering*, (Dade Circuit Court) nor *Volusia Jai-Alai v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering* (Dade County, Case No. 78-10636) had proceeded to final hearing. See last year's Annual Report p. 8. An appeal brought by a disciplined jockey challenging powers of both the stewards and the Division is pending in an appellate court. *Vasquez v. Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering*, Third District Court of Appeal, Case No. 79-897.

The only tarnish on a bright legal year for the Division came in *Bradley v. Tourist Attractions, Inc.*, 365 So.2d 436 (Fla. 3d DCA 1978). Pompano Park, a licensed horsetrack obtained a decision from the Third District Court of Appeal that it was owed more of an allowance under the statutory harness racing relief provisions of 1975 than was thought by the Division. The decision is not expected to be of any lasting significance since the particular provision in question expired in June of 1977.

#### NATIONAL COORDINATION

The Division is an active member of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners (NASRC), an organization representing all states which have

authorized pari-mutuel activities. Membership in the organization makes it possible to coordinate records from all racing jurisdictions and to exchange information and ideas necessary for effective regulations. Under a reciprocity agreement between all member states, each racing authority recognizes decisions and rulings made by other states.

Florida continues to be a subscriber of the National Association of State Racing Information System (NASRIS). This system permits the Division to have instant access to a computer located in Lexington, Kentucky which contains a complete record of all decisions and rulings issued by all racing states. This invaluable system gives the Division the capability of precluding ineligible persons from participating in pari-mutuel activities in Florida.

#### CONCLUSION

The Commission and the Division staff appreciates the support and cooperation which has been received from members of the Legislature and their staffs. We are especially indebted to Secretary R. B. Burroughs, Jr. and his entire staff for providing the leadership and assistance necessary for effective regulation of the pari-mutuel industry.






