FINAL ORDER

The Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering ("Petitioner"), issues this Final Order against George D. Barton, ("Respondent") as follows:

- 1. An Administrative Complaint was filed in this case on June 21, 2021, alleging that Respondent violated Section 550.0251(6), Florida Statutes, and Rule 61D-11.005(4), Florida Administrative Code. A copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached hereto as Exhibit "1" and incorporated by reference.
- 2. The Administrative Complaint, Election of Rights form, an Explanation of Rights, and a cover letter were served on Respondent via certified U.S. mail on June 23, 2021. Proof of service is attached hereto as Exhibit "2" and incorporated by reference.
- 3. The Election of Rights form, Explanation of Rights, and cover letter informed Respondent that a written response to the Administrative Complaint, including the right to request a hearing, was due within 21 days of actual service of the Administrative Complaint. *See* Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-106.111, Florida Administrative Code.

- 4. Petitioner informed Respondent that the failure to file a timely response to the Administrative Complaint shall be deemed a waiver of the right to a hearing.
- 5. Respondent has not filed a timely response to the Administrative Complaint.
 Respondent has not submitted any evidence or made any allegations that would support the application of the doctrine of equitable tolling.

Having considered the Administrative Complaint, the service of the Administrative Complaint with Election of Rights form, Explanation of Rights, and cover letter on Respondent along with Respondent's failure to respond, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, it is hereby

ORDERED and ADJUDGED:

- 6. The allegations of fact and the conclusions of law in the Administrative Complaint are adopted in their entirety herein.
- 7. Respondent is hereby **PERMANENTLY EXCLUDED** from all pari-mutuel facilities within the State of Florida.
- 8. Respondent's Pari-Mutuel Wagering Cardroom Employee Occupational License, number 8745209-1012, is hereby **REVOKED**.
- 9. This Final Order is effective on the date it is filed with the Agency Clerk of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, as indicated on the first page of this Order.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

The Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering ("Petitioner"), files this Administrative Complaint against George D. Barton ("Respondent"), and alleges:

- 1. Petitioner is the state agency charged with regulating pari-mutuel wagering and cardroom operations pursuant to Chapters 550 and 849, Florida Statutes
- 2. At all times material hereto, Respondent held a Pari-Mutuel Wagering Cardroom Employee Occupational License, number 8745209-1012, issued by Petitioner.
- 3. At all times material hereto, Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc. was a facility operated by a permitholder authorized to conduct pari-mutuel wagering and cardroom operations in the State of Florida.
- 4. On or about April 10, 2021, Respondent was an employee at Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc. working at Table #5 and was observed taking chips from the pot and placing them in his impress tray.

- 5. On or about April 10, 2021, Respondent was an employee at Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc. working at Table #6 and was observed taking chips from the pot and placing them in his impress tray.
- 6. On or about April 14, 2021, Respondent was terminated and excluded from Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc.

COUNT I

- 7. Petitioner realleges and incorporates the allegations contained within paragraphs one through six as though fully set forth herein.
 - 8. Rule 61D-11.005(4), Florida Administrative Code, provides in relevant part:

No person shall, either directly or indirectly:

- (a) Employ or attempt to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud any participant in a game or the cardroom operator.
- (b) Engage in any act, practice, or course of operation that would constitute a fraud or deceit upon any participant in a game or the cardroom operator.
- (c) Engage in any act, practice, or course of operation with the intent of cheating any participant or the cardroom operator.
- 9. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated Rule 61D-11.005(4), Florida Administrative Code, by taking chips from the pot and placing them in his impress tray, while working as a cardroom dealer at Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc. on April 9 and 10, 2021.

COUNT II

- 10. Petitioner realleges and incorporates the allegations contained within paragraphs one through five as though fully set forth herein.
 - 11. Section 550.0251(6), Florida Statutes, provides in relevant part:

In addition to the power to exclude certain persons from any parimutuel facility in the state, the division may exclude any person from any and all pari-mutuel facilities in this state for conduct that would constitute, if the person were a licensee, a violation of this chapter or the rules of the division. The division may exclude from

any pari-mutuel facility within this state any person who has been ejected from a pari-mutuel facility in this state or who has been excluded from any pari-mutuel facility in another state by the governmental department, agency, commission, or authority exercising regulatory jurisdiction over pari-mutuel facilities in such other state.

(Emphasis supplied).

12. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated Section 550.0251(6), Florida Statutes and is subject to exclusion from all licensed pari-mutuel wagering facilities in the State of Florida based on his exclusion from Jacksonville Kennel Club, Inc. on April 10, 2021.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests the Division Director enter an Order excluding Respondent from all licensed pari-mutuel facilities in the State of Florida, along with any other remedy provided by Chapter 550 and 849, Florida Statutes, and/or the rules promulgated thereunder.

Mediation under Section 120.573, Florida Statutes, is not available to resolve this Administrative Complaint.

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
